

Cowboys selected for all-league team

The Goodland Cowboys had four players named to the first team, nine to second team and four honorable mentions for the Northwest Kansas League All-League football team.

Goodland's first-team selections were: on offense, senior Tanner Smith, wide receiver, and senior Josh Doke, tight end; on defense, senior T.J. Hawkins, linebacker; and senior Ren Scherling, kicker.

Second-team selections were: on offense, junior Travis Angelos, quarterback; senior Casey Henderson, running back; and senior Aaron Deeds, guard; on defense, Henderson, linebacker; senior A.J. Stephens, defensive line, and senior Forrest Trachsel, defensive back; and on special teams, junior Brandon Rome, punter, and senior Bob Doxon, long snapper.

Receiving honorable mention were: on offense, junior Fernando Martinez, running back, and junior Clay Schilling, center; and on defense, senior Jake Kling, defensive back, and junior Jace Mosbarger, defensive line.

Henderson was a second-team running back last season, said Coach Jonathan Dansel, but was moved to fullback this year because he is a great blocker. This year, he had 276 yards rushing and three touchdowns.

Angelos led the league with 648 passing yards, the coach said, and had 516 yards rushing for 1,164 yards total offense.

Doke had three receptions for 49 yards, the coach said, and did a good job blocking on the edge.

Martinez had 777 rushing yards and five touchdowns, while Smith led the league with 281 yards on 20 receptions, Dansel said. He averaged 14

yards per catch.

Trachsel had 30 tackles and one interception. Hawkins had 124 tackles (82 solo), averaging 12.4 per game. He had 4 sacks, 2 interceptions, 4 caused fumbles and 1 blocked kick.

Stephens was fourth on the team in tackles with 64 and caused 2 fumbles. He was first-team all-league last season.

Henderson had 89 tackles (49 solo), averaging 8.9 per game, with one sack.

Mosbarger was fifth on the team with 61 tackles. He had 2 touchdowns off of fumble recoveries and caused even more, Dansel said.

Rome led the league with 25 punts for 37.64 yards, the coach said. Ren Scherling was first-team all-league kicker as a sophomore and junior; he was 10 for 11 on points after touchdown and averaged kicking the ball to the 12-yard line on 27 kick-offs.

Former Cowgirl plays role in Colby's first win

A Goodland native added a free throw to ice the Colby Community College Lady Trojans' victory Saturday, helping the team get its first win of the season.

Whitney Archer, a former Goodland Cowgirl, connected on three three-pointers on her way to a 15-point night Tuesday against Air Force Prep.

Archer added an extra point to the Lady Trojans' score Saturday, following teammate Sandra Sormaz's two big three-point shots that put the team ahead in a game they trailed most of the way.

Despite Archer's scoring Tuesday, the Lady Trojans lost 67-57 to Air Force Prep at home.

It didn't look promising for a while Saturday, but the Lady Tro-

jans had just the right ingredients for their first win of the year, 63-58 over Casper College, in their final game of the Ambassador Classic at the Colby Community Building.

"It was good win," said coach Tom Stephens. "Our team needed it."

Behind 53-50 with just over two minutes left, the Lady Trojans appeared to be headed for another dead offensive possession, but Sormaz bailed her teammates out with a three-point basket to tie the game as the shot clock expired.

After a Thunderbird miss, Sormaz dribbled the ball down the floor, pulled up to the three-point arc and connected again with 1:35 to go, giving the team a 56-53 lead, just

their second lead of the game.

The Trojans connected on 5 of 6 free throws in the final 28.8 seconds to hold off a Thunderbirds' comeback bid. Sperser hit two to make it 60-55.

Following a three-pointer from Casper, Sormaz hit two free throws to boost the lead back to 62-58 with 12.7 seconds left.

Casper's next three-pointer came up short, then Archer hit one of two free throws with 1.0 left to add a little more breathing room.

The Lady Trojans' 38-point second-half performance and 44 percent shooting effort (12-27) was a major improvement from the first 20 minutes, which saw Colby scoring just 25 points and shooting 28.6 percent (10-35) from the field.

Defensively, Colby allowed the Thunderbirds to shoot only 39.7 percent for the game.

Casper opened the game with an 8-2 run and led 27-25 at half time. Sormaz led the way for Colby with 18 points. Oberlin native Lauren Fortin chipped in 10.

In Tuesday's game, Sormaz's 17-footer gave the Lady Trojans a 52-51 lead with 7:01 remaining, but Colby ran out of steam and Air Force used a 16-5 run in the final seven minutes to win 67-57.

After starting the second half scorching hot from the field, the Lady Trojans scored only two more baskets after Sormaz's hoop with 7:01 left, one of which was a lay-up in the last few seconds from Fortin after

the game had been decided.

The Lady Trojans shot just 21-70 (30 percent) from the field, including a woeful 7-33 (21.2 percent) from behind the three-point line.

Guard Katie Sperser found the iron most unkind, shooting 2-14 overall and 0-7 from three-point land. The team allowed Air Force to shoot 50 percent (30-60) from the field and grab 13 offensive rebounds.

The Lady Trojans were led by Sormaz, who scored 18 points despite shooting 6-17, including just 2-10, from behind the three-point line.

Colby (1-6) will look to get back on the winning track this weekend when the team travels to Sterling, Colo., to take on Northeastern Colo-

rado on Friday and the Concordia (Neb.) junior varsity on Saturday.

Colby doesn't return home until Jan. 2, when they play Garden City at the community building.
