Cowboys bring experience to court

Returning starters vie for spots

slcorcoran@nwkansas.com The Goodland High Cowboys expect to hit the basketball court with a big team and several experienced players this year.

Competition will be tight for varsity playing time, the coach says, and the freshman team has nearly as many members as the varsity and junior varsity combined.

But being one of the smallest Class 4A schools will put Goodland up against some tough competition on the basketball court, said Coach Brad Bergsma, starting his first year as head coach. Bergsma replaces Jon McLean, who moved to Buhler, a large Class 4A school northeast of Hutchinson.


In his eight years as head basketball coach, McLean, with Bergsma as his assistant, improved the record from a first season 6-14 to a 16-7 record that included a 7-0 run to win the Northwest Kansas League title this last year. His team got into the sub-state championship at least twice, losing to the eventual Class 4A state champion.

There are 14 freshmen this year, Bergsma said, nearly half the 30 players on the team. The varsity has three returning starters, 6 foot, 1 inch senior Tanner Smith, 6 foot, 1 inch junior Travis Angelos and 5 foot, 10 inch junior Greg Farris.

"They all led the team in scoring at one point last season," Bergsma said. "I'm excited."

There will be pretty good competition for the varsity spots, the coach said, with 6 foot, 1 inch senior Forrest Trachsel, 5 foot, 10 inch senior Preston Dautel, 5 foot, 11 senior Grant Wilkens, 6 foot senior Josh Doke and 6 foot junior Brandon Rome all vying for time on the court.

Bergsma said he expects a good season from Dautel and a lot of help from Wilkens.



"so the younger kids could learn the lingo, the lexicon we use. I didn't want to hurt them by passing them over on offensive and defensive sets. We will have them at the level we need to be to compete."

The team's biggest challenge, Bergsma said, is size. Goodland is the low man on the totem pole in Class 4A, he said, and will be facing teams from schools with more than twice its enrollment. And they will face some big players.

Topside Tip-off will be bringing players well over 6 foot, he said, and Class 6A Dodge City — with 1,228 students - is six times the size of Goodland High. Ottawa always comes to the Tip-off, he said, and though they dropped from Class 5A last year to 4A this year, they are still more than twice the size of Goodland with 513 students.

The good news is that facing such tough competition will make the 5 foot, 9 inch Victor Diaz; 5 foot, Cowboys tougher and hone their 10 inch Eric Linnell; 6 foot, 1 inch skills, he said.




