

Reasoner said four men recently returned from Iraqi and in all, 11 have been sent to the wartorn country since Operation Iraqi Freedom began in 2003. Two served two tours of duty. One, Sgt. Ernie Gonzales, was injured, and another, Derrick Lutters gave his life. Reasoner recognized those men and women during the ceremony, which also included awarding of prizes for the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary's Voices of Democracy speech contest and Patriot's Pen essay contest. 


