Cattle from Century Feeders of Goodland took four of eight national GridMaster Awards at the 2007 National Red Angus Association of America convention in Dodge City.

The award is given to producers, owners and feeders who produced superior beef carcasses marketed through the Angus America Grid.

The awards were given at the convention Wednesday through Saturday, Sept. 26 to 29.

Of the four sets of cattle in the contest, two belonged to John Boroff of Daniel, Wyo., and one each to Wedel Red Angus of Leoti and McIntire Ranch of Jordan, Mont.

GridMaster cattle are picked from the Red Angus Feeder Cattle

Certification Program run by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The program traces Angus bloodlines, verifies ranch of origin and age group. The beef is marketed at participating Cargill plants.

"The award is mostly for the owners," said Dale Kenny of Century Feeders.
