Two Bird City families rebuild from tornadoes

On March 28, when more than 60 tornadoes touched ground in Kansas, one passed Bird City, barely missing

the town but hitting several farms. Ed and Phyllis Carson's farm did not receive a direct hit, but damage

When the couple came up from the basement, they said, the inside of the house did not appear to have been hit too badly. However, they soon discovered the two-story house had been lifted off its foundation and set back down. The home they had lived in for 26 years had to be torn down.

Just northeast of Bird City, the tornado veered toward the Ketzner farm. This time it was a direct hit.

Nick and Heidi Ketzner, along with their sons Dylan and Brady, barely made it into their cellar before the tornado passed right over them. The destruction was complete. The house Mr. Ketzner had bought in 1992 and brought his new bride to was gone. Not one structure on the farm remained undamaged.

Cheyenne County emergency manager Gary Rogers reported an estimated \$240,000 of structural damage done by that one tornado, family in May.

not including vehicles, crops or outside structures.

Within 24 hours, the residents of Bird City were out in the hundreds, helping farmers with cleanup. However, the help did not stop there. In the eight months that have followed, meals have been provided, money has been raised, donations have come from private contributors and families to help with the rebuilding. Some of the construction work has been done by Bird City residents, family and friends on weekends.

"The rebuilding is almost complete," said Mr. Carson earlier this month, adding that it has not been easy. Construction work still turns up foundation damage, he said. Still, when thinking about that night and what could have happened, Mrs. Carson said she is thankful.

For the Ketzner family, everything had to be replaced — furniture, clothing, everything. Some things are not replaceable. Mrs. Ketzner cannot locate their wedding album and has been trying to get in touch with the photographer who took the pictures. Nor can she find her baby pictures or her husband's. But life has moved on for the Ketzners; in fact, they will be adding to their
