

Cowboys win dual, second at Sainty

Goodland's wrestlers started their season winning a dual on the road Thursday and then took second at the St. Francis "Gabel-Jenkins" Invitational Tournament Saturday.

They beat the Hoxie Indians 50-30 Thursday, and with three wrestlers finishing first in their weight classes, four second and three third, the Cowboys were second at St. Francis with 138 points. Colby won with 170.5, and Wray, Colo., was third with 82.5. St. Francis had 68 points, Scott City 63, Rawlins County 57 and Wichita County 13.

Goodland had six wrestlers win by fall at Hoxie — junior Kade Sheldon over Donovan Schamberger at 112, freshman Nathan Deeds over Cayle Taylor at 130, senior A.J. Stephens over Clayton Schamberger at 140, junior Keegan Smith over Dylan Bainter at 145 (technical fall), junior Fernando Martinez over Danny Baker at 189 and senior Bob Doxon over Dillon Salmans at 275.

Junior Ryan Taylor beat Quinn Aumiller 3-1 at 171, and freshman Seth Miller at 103 and junior Josh Lamb at 152 each got forfeits.

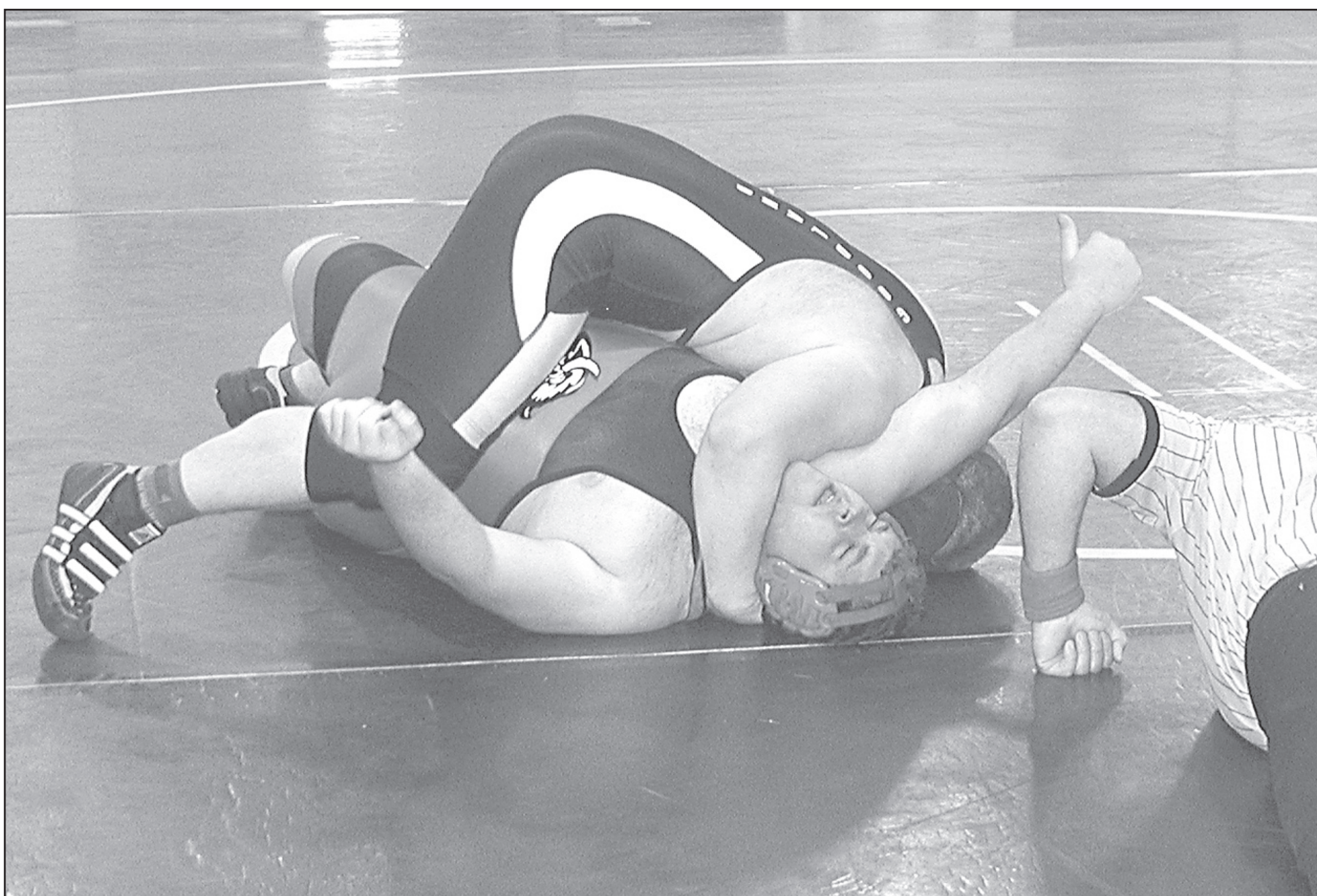
The Cowboys forfeited to Chris Heim at 119 and Kevin Moss at 135.

Three Cowboys lost their matches — freshman Kayler Rietcheck fell to Trevor Popp at 125, senior Aaron Deeds fell to Clayton Rall at 160 and senior Ren Scherling fell to Cody Pope at 215.

"Performances that stood out were how well our freshman wrestlers competed," said Coach Joseph Sramek. "For being the first competition of their high school career, they did an excellent job."

The Hoxie squad is very much improved, the coach said, adding that he is really glad to see that they have increased their number of participants.

In the St. Francis tournament, Cowboys who were first in their

weight classes were Stephens at 140 with a 3-0 record; Aaron Deeds at 152, 3-0; and Doxon at 275, 2-0. Finishing second were Smith at 145, 1-1; Taylor at 171, 1-1; Martinez at 189, 2-1; and Scherling at 215, 2-1.

In third were Miller at 103, 0-2; Sheldon at 112, 2-1; and Nathan Deeds at 130, 2-1. Rietcheck was 0-3 at 125 and did not place.

"As for the dual and the first tournament," Sramek said, "I felt

our wrestlers got off to a good start and their hard work in the practice room has translated into success on the mat."

The Cowboys will dual Atwood at 5:30 p.m. Thursday at home.

Atwood has improved a great deal since last year, the coach said, adding that he believes they will only be open at one weight class.

The Colby tournament on Friday and Saturday will be a dual tourna-

ment, Sramek said; the Cowboys will wrestle seven duals on the weekend.

"This will allow our wrestlers to get a lot of matches versus some tough competition," he said.
