
New sign installed for Junior High Gym

Radio operators contact the world

Floyd said the atmospheric conditions change and those changes effect how well a radio signal travels, and he said it appeared the conditions were better last year allowing the radio operators to reach more stations.

Police Officer Jim Gillespie, another of the Goodland radio operators, said he was making contacts through an Echolink system, which connects stations through a computer.

Gillespie said he enjoys using Echolink because it allows him to make contacts around the world, and he has several people he contacts regularly, including one in Estonia.

Using Echolink expands his reach with a low-power radio, Gillespie said, and he can talk to a lot of different people through an Echolink conference connection. He can see the contact information on the computer monitor, and using a microphone, he talks to the person on the other end and can listen to the conversation through his computer's speakers.

from Sparta, Mo. Gillespie and Christopher exchanged call signs and weather information as part of their short conversation.

During the event, the radio operators used headphones so the other people did not hear both sides of the conversation. That kept the noise level down for weather forecasters. who were doing their work, as well as for the other radio operators.

Using Echolink, Gillespie was net control for an hour of Weather Talk, a conference setup allowing a large number of stations to make contact, with the Goodland station handling all the traffic.

Floyd said among the other hams who participated were Bob McLamore, Colby fire chief; Mike Albers, Thomas County assistant emergency manager; and Nathan Reitcheck of Levant.

Al Pietrycha, Weather Service science and operations officer, was in to help set up and work the radios. Pietrycha, the contact with the hams during severe weather, said he has been working with the Echolink and repeater systems.
