
Cowgirls beat Skyline in Topside

With the victory, the Cowgirls moved into the consolation championship against the Ottawa Lady Cyclones on Saturday morning, but lost that game 47-32.

In the first round of the annual holiday tournament Thursday, the Cowgirls had faced the Norton Lady Blue Jays, losing 62-36. The Lady Jays were in the championship on Saturday, losing to the defending Class 4A Champion Colby Lady Eagles, 56-49.

Goodland Coach Don Smith said he was glad the Cowgirls were able to get their first victory. Smith said the girls are showing improvement every game.

Herl had 27 points on 5 three-point baskets, 4 field goals and 4 free throws. Raymer had 13 with one three-point basket 3 field goals and 4 free throws. Gonzales finished with 7 points, Archer 6, Schields 6, Hall, 4 and Courtney Sheldon 2.

The Cowgirls were out rebounded by the Lady Falcons 47 to 37, but Smith said he thought the teams was down by about 20 rebounds at halftime. He thought the girls had done a better job in the second half and it showed.


