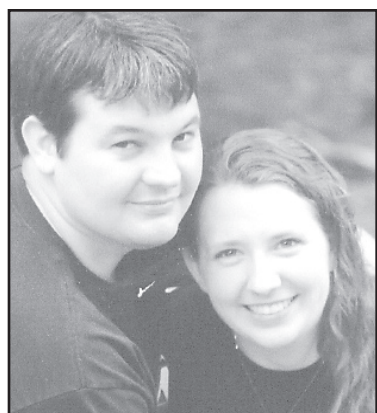
The couple will renew their vows in a private ceremony before the reception. They married on Dec. 28, 1957, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Burlington.

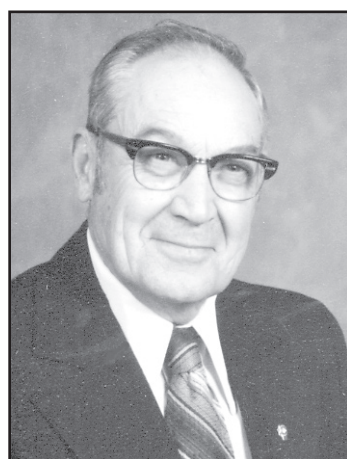
