Missouri Lawmakers React to Kansas Tax bill

In reaction to passage of House Bill 2641 by the Kansas House, Missouri lawmakers hurried a tax repeal bill though their chambers this week. The bill eliminates the property tax deduction for residents of any state that does not give Kansas residents the same deduction. As a result, Missouri Legislators

have drafted an identical bill that would reestablish the deduction. This is a major victory for the House and its leadership who have worked closely with Missouri lawmakers to ensure that Kansas citizens are

Energy

All eyes were to be on the House Energy and Utilities Committee this week as it planned to work on House Bill 2711 allowing for expansion of the Sunflower coal plant in Holcomb with and establishes new environmental regulations.

However, it was announced on Friday that the bill has been pulled

Specifically the bill would establish a carbon tax emissions cap and net metering. This would be the first environmental regulations in the nation imposed at the state level.



Speaker Neufeld formed a Select Committee on Energy and Environment for the Future earlier this week charged with establishing long-term energy policy. The committee will be chaired by Representative Don Myers (R Derby).

Budget

Other than the energy bill, sound fiscal policy is the driving force this session. Budget committees are working hard hearing agency requests.

In this tough fiscal time, the best approach for these agencies is to find the money internally by taking a close look at how they have allocated budget dollars in the past and cut out wasteful spending and outdated or under-performing

The House Appropriations committee voted in favor of a set of guidelines for the Fiscal Year 2009 budget. These guidelines call for the committees to eliminate from the Governor's budget all but the required increases in State General Fund Spending.

This includes proposed budget enhancements and assumed gaming revenues and places even more strain on the State General Fund. Included is support for the State Employee Pay Plan and the five-year transition to a new state pay system. Essentially it will hold salary adjustments to 1.5 percent instead of the 2.5 percent recommended by the

Substitute for House Bill 2336, An act concerning sales taxation; relating to exemptions; food disaster emergencies; certain construction materials and ser-

HB 2730, passed out of my Efficiency and Technology Committee. It relates to public finance; creating the Kansas taxpayer transparency act; defining terms; requiring the secretary of administration to develop and operate a specified website; enumerating information which shall be made available on the website; establishing the public finance transparency board and prescribing its duties; and providing for nondisclosure of non-public information.

HB 2495, An act concerning income taxation; relating to corporations; surtax.

HB 2774, An act concerning immigration; requiring the adjutant general to request certain information from the United States immigrations and customs enforcement and to establish communications with certain foreign countries.

ing about spring and the things that you would like to get done in the yard. If one of those is to put in or renovate a windbreak, now is the time to be getting those orders in for conservation trees from the Kansas Forest Service.

The service offers low-cost tree and shrub seedlings for use in conservation plantings. Plants are 1 to 2 years old, and 12 to 16 inches tall. The agency accepts orders from now through the first week in May each year.

Order early to ensure getting the items you want. Orders ship from the second week of March through the first week of May. Approved uses for these plants include windbreaks, wood lots, riparian plantings, wildlife habitat, educational purposes and Christmas trees. They may not be used for landscape (ornamental) plantings or grown for resale.

Though you can get a single species, four special bundles are available, designed to provide a place for songbirds, pheasant (western Kansas), quail (eastern Kansas) and




