# Cowgirls lose 55-33 to Lady Plainsmen

ntbetz@nwkansas.com The Goodland High Cowgirls got a slow start in the first quarter Friday against the Oakley Lady Plainsmen, digging a hole they could not climb out of to lose the game 55-33 at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

It was the Cowgirls' final home game, and the loss dropped the team record to 6-12 and to 3-2 in Northwest Kansas League play.

Freshman Jade Herl gave the Goodland girls their first lead with a three-point basket with six minutes left in the first quarter. Senior Sammie Raymer regained the lead a minute later with a basket to make it 5-4. Then, the Lady Plainsmen went on a nine-point run to lead 14-5 with 1:31 left in the quarter. At the buzzer, Oakley led 19-6 on a last-second steal and basket.

In the second quarter, the Plainsmen continued stretching their lead to 24-6 before the Cowgirls got a little spark on a basket by freshman Ashley Archer. A few seconds later Archer passed to Raymer, who put it in to cut the lead to 24-10. Another pass from Archer to junior Erika Gonzales made it 26-12 with about five minutes to go.

However, the Oakley girls came back to extend their lead to 32-14 at half time. The third quarter saw the Cow-

girls outscored Oakley 14-10, leaving them behind 46-24. In the final period, the Cowgirls matched the Plainsmen 9-9 to lose 55-33.

Cowgirls Coach Don Smith said the team had a tough start in the first

"We have not had too many of those," Smith said. "We have done better most of the year, but had a real difficult time in the first quarter against Oakley."

Smith said he had planned to scout a game at Oakley on Tuesday, but the snowstorm put a stop "We had planned some different


