

Underclassmen compete in track meets

The Goodland High freshman and sophomore track teams were in Atwood and Tribune in April, with several placing in the top six at each meet.

The Cowgirls were fifth out of nine teams at Greeley County on Monday, April 28, while the Cowboys were eighth out of nine. Only individual results were available from Atwood on Monday, April 21; team scores were not available from the school.

Goodland's 3,200-meter relay team of sophomore Ben Waugh and freshmen Talison Crosby, Stephen Buller and Kayler Rietcheck finished third in 10 minutes, 38.56 seconds.

In the boys 110-meter hurdles, freshman Brock Wilkens took third in 18.28 seconds, and in the girls 100-meter hurdles, freshman Jade Herl finished fourth in 18.

Sophomore Jay Cotter took third in the

discus with a 112 feet, 8 inch, throw, and competed in shot put.

In the boys high jump, freshman Kelly Pearson and Wilkens tied for fourth, jumping 5 feet.

In the girls pole vault, sophomore Jessi Geist tied for fifth, leaping 6 feet, 6 inches, and among the boys, sophomore Ben Waugh was sixth at 8 feet. Freshmen Day Waugh and Ryan Fisher also jumped.

Sophomore Alexis Bateman and Pearson competed in long jump and freshman Dillon Trachsel and Fisher in the triple jump.

The 400-meter relay team of freshman Herl, Bateman, Geist and freshman Jennifer Rome finished fifth in 58.74 seconds.

In the 1,600-meter relay, the girls team of Rome, Herl, Bateman and freshman Christy Studer ran fourth in 5:1.33. The boys team of Fisher, sophomore Ismael

Garcia, Trachsel and Rietcheck finished sixth in 4:36.78.

Wilkens finished fifth in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in 47.71 seconds. Buller finished fifth in the 3,200-meter run in 12 minutes, 44.5 seconds. Crosby did it in 14:7.38.

In the 400-meter run, Herl took sixth in 1:12.84. Day Waugh finished in 1:22.84. Among the boys, Trachsel finished in 1:3.49, Rietcheck in 1:3.84 and Garcia in 1:6.12.

In the 100-meter dash, Geist finished in 14.84 seconds, freshman Jennifer Rome in 15.32 and Day Waugh in 16.93. Among the boys, Garcia finished in 13.01 and Pearson in 13.03.

In the 1,600-meter run, Buller finished in 5:59.34, and Ben Waugh in 6:8.36. Studer finished in 7:12.54.

In the 800-meter run, Ben Waugh finished in 2:38.18, Crosby in 2:42 and Rietcheck in 2:58.09. In the 200-meter dash, Garcia finished in 27.1 seconds. Bateman finished in 30.06, Day Waugh in 34.94, and Rome was disqualified for taking off before the gun.

At Greeley County, the girls finished fifth with 52 points. Colby won with 155, Dundie County, Neb. (Benkelman), was second with 141, Burlington third with 91 and Oberlin fourth with 74. Behind Goodland were St. Francis with 34, Rawlins County with 31, Quinter with 23 and Oakley with 21.

Among the boys, Goodland was eighth with 24. Dundie County won with 112, Colby was second with 111, Burlington third with 95 and St. Francis fourth with 64. Quinter had 52, Oakley 45, and Oberlin 28. Last was Rawlins County with eight.

In the 100-meter hurdles, Herl took fourth in 18 seconds. She finished sixth in the 400-meter run in 1:12.84. Geist tied for fifth with Ashley Beall of Dundie County in the pole vault, leaping 6' 6".

The Cowgirls finished fourth in the 4x400-meter relay in 5:1.33, and fifth in the 4x100-meter relay in 58.74 seconds.

Among the boys, Cotter was third in discus with a throw of 112 feet, 8 inches. Wilkens finished third in the 110-meter high hurdles in 18.28 seconds and fifth in the 300-meter hurdles in 47.71.

Pearson and Wilkens tied for fourth in high jump, leaping 5 feet. Ben Waugh was sixth in pole vault at 8 feet. Buller was fifth in the 3,200-meter run in 12:44.5

The Cowboys took third in the 4x800-meter relay in 10:8.56, and fifth in the 4x400-meter relay in 4:36.78.

Junior high holds meet

The sky was blue and the temperature in the mid 70s with light winds last Thursday as Grant Junior High played host to a track meet with teams from Colby, Burlington, St. Francis and Quinter.

Colby won the seventh-grade girls competition with 109 points, Quinter was second 57, Burlington third 34.5, St. Francis fourth 19 and Goodland fifth with 12.

Colby won the eighth-grade girls competition with 111 points, St. Francis was second with 35, Burlington third 34, Quinter fourth 30, and Goodland fifth at 18.

The Mustangs seventh-grade boys finished third with 32.5 points. Colby won the seventh grade boys meet with 87, Burlington was second at 59, Quinter fourth 26.5, and St. Francis fifth 12.

The Mustang eighth-grade boys finished second with 67 points. Colby won with 72, Burlington was third at 51, Quinter fourth 27, and St. Francis fifth 12.

Seventh grade girls finishing in the top five include Courtney Cowan, fourth in shot putt with a throw of 26 feet, 6.5 inch; Chantel Coates, fourth in pole vault at 5 feet; Lacie Cowan fifth in the 1,600-meter run at 7:00.8; and Shayley Miller fourth in the 800-meter run 3:35.8.

The Lady Mustangs were third in the 4x200-meter relay at 2:13.7 and in the 4x100 relay with 1:07.7. Goodland was fifth in the 4x400 relay at 5:21.5. Quinter won with 5:00.2.

Eighth-grade girls finishing in the top five included Sydney Winston, first in shot putt with 31 feet, 6 inches, and fifth in the 400-meter dash at 1:14; Jacee Herl third in discus 63 feet, 9.5 inch; and M'Lynn Hinger, third in pole vault (no height given).

The Lady Mustangs were third in the 4x100 relay with 1:01. Colby won in 56 seconds.

Seventh-grade boys finishing in the top five include Aaron Twombly, third in shot putt with 33 feet, 8 inch, and second in discus at 11 feet, 1 inch; Cy Paxton tied for third in high jump at 4 feet, 6 inch and was second in long jump with 13 feet, 11 inch; Gage Owens, fifth in long jump at 12 feet, 8.1 inch; and Dylan McLemore, first in 100-meter

hurdles, 17.34 seconds.

The Mustangs were third in the 4x200 relay with 2:17.19 and third in the 4x100 relay (no time).

Eighth grade boys finishing in the top five include Dallas DeLaRosa, first in discus at 136 feet, 10 inch and second in shot putt 37 feet, 7.5 inch; Laine Herl, fifth in shot putt 34 feet, 11.75 inches, and fifth in discus at 105 feet, 1 inch; Ryder Kling, fourth in 100-meter hurdles at 18.91 and tied for fifth in high jump, 4 feet, 8 inches;

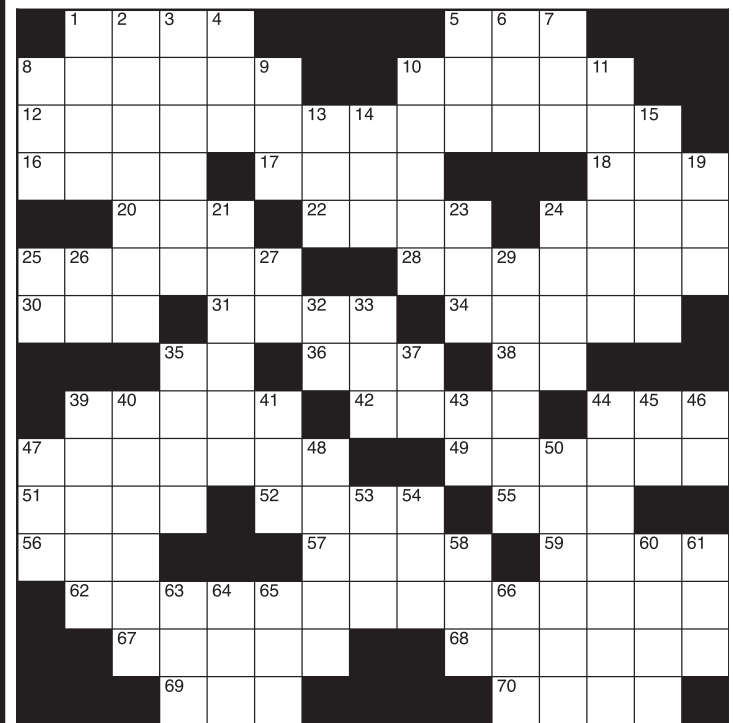
Blaine Luther, second in pole vault, 8 feet, 6 inch; third in 100-meter hurdles at 17.96; and third in long jump, 15 feet, 5.5 inch; Austin Avelar, third in pole vault, 8 feet; Alex Rangel, fifth

in pole vault at 7 feet, 6 inch; Reed Bellamy, first in 100-meter hurdles 15.88 seconds, and third in triple jump 33 feet, 10 inches;

Riley Oharah, second in 100-meter dash 12.32 and second in 200-meter dash 25.44; Kaylan Weber, third in 100-meter dash 12.47 and fourth in 200-meter dash at 26.06; Jason Cowan, second in 1,600-meter run with 5:34; Garrett Geist, third in 800-meter run at 2:46.6; and Corey Davis, fifth in 800-meter run 3:14.

Goodland was second in the 4x200 relay with a time of 1:51.4 and second in the 4x100 relay at 50.67 seconds. The Mustangs won the 4x400 relay in 4:14.01.

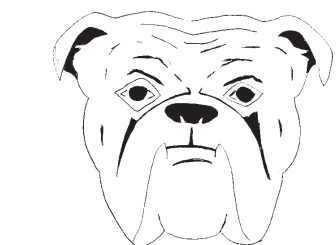
