road truck of this type is brought into the city, the owner will be required to have the Kansas Highway Patrol do a title inspection. He said the owner will take the form from the state trooper to the county treasurer's office and the state Department of Revenue will issue a nonhighway title and a copy of that has to be in the vehicle at all times. He said with the title in hand and proof of insurance, the owner can go to the city police to be registered.

Commissioner Dave Daniels questioned how the city was going to know which vehicles are registered.

Mason said Chief Smee has ordered a sticker to be put on the front driver's-side window.

Jerry Ohara, a retired state highway employee, who has been trying to get the vehicles approved, said he thought the sticker was a good idea.

"I have gone to a lot of trouble to get this done," Ohara said, who has published in The Goodland Starbeen trying to register and sell the mini-pickups.
