An Ordinance Authorizing the Operation of Work-site Utility on he Streets Within the Corporate Limits of the City of GOODLAND; and Providing forRelated Matters Including Penalties for Violation Thereof.
Be it Ordained by the Govern ing Body of the City of Goodland, Kansas:
SECTION 1. OPERATION OF WORK-SITE UTILITY VEHICLES; PENALTY. (a) Work-site
utility vehicles may be operated upon the public highways, streets, roads and alleys within (b) corporate limits of the city. (b) gWork-site utility vehicle h means any motor vehicle which is not less than 48 inches in width, has an overall length, in-
cluding the bumper, of not more than 135 inches, has an unladen than 135 inches, has an unladen of more than 800 pounds and is equipped with four or more low pressure tires, a steering wheel and bench or bucket type seating allowing at least two people to sit side-by-side, and may be equipped with a bed or (c) No hauling materials (c) No work-site utility vehicle
shall be operated on any public highway, street, road or alley unless such vehicle shall comply
with the equipment require-
ments under the provisions of article 17, chapter 8 ofthe Kan sas Statutes Annotated
(d) Every person operating a public highways, streets on the public highways, streets, roads subject to all of the duties applicable to a driver of a vehicle imposed by law.
(e) A violation of this section shall be deemed an ordinance traffic infraction. Upon an entry of a plea of guilty or no contest or upon being convicted of such

SAME: VALID DRIVER fS LICENSE REQhall operate a work-site utility vehicle on any public highway street, road or alley within the corporate limits of the city uness such person has a valid driver fs license. Violation of this section is punishable by a fine of not more than $\$ 1,000$ or by mprisonment for not more than six months or by both such fine and imprisonment
SECTION 3. SAME: Insur-
ance required. No person shall
operate a work-site utility veoperate a work-site utility vestreet, or road or alley within the corporate limits of the City unless such person has in place liability insurance coverage Evidence of insurance shall be carried in the work-site utility vehicle at all times. Violation of this section is punishable by fine of not more than $\$ 1,000.00$ or by imprisonment of not more that six (6) months or by both such ine and imprisonment.

SECTION 4. SAME; INSPECTION BY KANSAS HIGHWAY PATROLREQUIREDANDKANREQUIRED. All work-site utility vehicles shall be inspected for the purpose of obtaining a Kansas Non-Highway title. The Kansas Non-Highway title shall be carried in the work-site utilof this
section is punishable by fine f not more than $\$ 1,000.00$ orby imprisonment of not more that six (6) months or by both such ine and imprisonment.
SECTION 5. SAME: Registration and registration sticker required. No person shall operate
a work-site utility vehicle on any awork-siteutity vehicle onany
alley within the corporate limits of the City unless without first having secured a registration sticker as provided hereinafter. The registration sticker shall be vehicle on the lower left side front windshield.

Application for registration to operate a work-site utility vehicle shall be made to the Chief of Police or any employee of the Police Department designated by the Chief of Police. The application shall be accompanied to the Police Department upon the granting of a registration. The registration fee shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00). In addition, the application shall be accompanied by proof of insurance, the non-highway title and proof of a driver fs license for the operator. Upon receipt of such
application, the Police Departapplication, the Police Departregistration sticker which shall be immediately attached to the front lowerleft side windshield of the work-site utility vehicle. The removal of any such tag except by the proper authorities shall be a violation of this article.

The registration shall be valid for the period of time that the work-site utility vehicle is owned by the applicant and shall ex pire upon the work-site utility
vehicle being sold or otherwis disposed of by the applicant Violation of this section is punishable by a fine of not more than $\$ 1,000.00$ or by imprisonmento not more than six (6) months or by both such fine and imprisonSectio
Section 6. PUBLICATION; EF FECTIVE DATE: This ordinance
