Jean Hutton, 83, Brewster homemaker and pilot, died Friday, May 16, 2008 at the Colby Care Center.

She was born on Nov. 12, 1924, to Willis A. and Lenora (Richardson) Kenyon in Trego County. She graduated from Fort Hays State in 1945 and was a music teacher at Brewster from 1946 to June 2, 1948, when she married William Edward Hutton. Mrs. Hutton was a homemaker, educator and editor of the book, "Petticoat Pioneers" for the General Federation of Women's Clubs. She flew small planes and the airport in Brewster is named after the family.
