Goodland High's track teams both vaulted 8 feet, 6 inches. came out at the bottom of the pile at the league meet Friday, May9, in Colby, earning only one gold, one silver and two bronze medals.

The Cowboys earned 37.5 points to place eighth as a team, while the Cowgirls had eight points for last
