Couple plans Burlington wedding

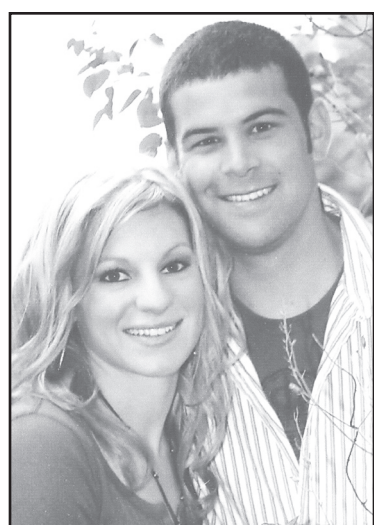
