Topliff said the metal roof restoration system would replace the leaking panels, refurbish the skylights and put two coats of a liquid membrane on the whole roof.

Malsom said his two options were to replace the panels, fix the vents and replace the skylights for \$45,400, or to do a patch find some skylights, but that would be an job for \$12,000 to give the city time to budget for a complete new roof.

"The panels are obsolete, but we could put that in for \$45,000," he said, "but feel like that is wasting money for this. "For \$12,000 we could patch it with a latex system that will work for five years. You way," Malsom said. "I recommend you could put it in the budget for replacement in the future.

Dechant asked Malsom what he would estimate the cost of a new roof would be based on the square feet.

Topliff said it would probably take about 30 days to do the full roof coat.

Commissioner Annette Fairbanks said it worried her if the plan was just to fix the leaks rather than going for a longer time. She said the Weathercraft plan is more money, but does cover the entire roof.
