

Swimmers get gold, break pool records

The Goodland Swim Club opened its season with a bang at Holyoke, Colo., finishing third, with swimmers winning eight individual gold medals and relay teams five, breaking pool records in four events.

Goodland earned 157 points. Colby won the meet with 286, and Oberlin was second with 194. Following Goodland were Wray, Colo., with 137, Holyoke 128, Burlington 88, St. Francis 68, Flagler, Colo., 53, Oakley 12 and Limon, Colo., two.

The Goodland team will hold its annual home swim meet beginning at 8 a.m. Saturday at Steever Water Park. Warm-ups begin at 7 a.m.

Zach Miller and Ian Bonsall (11-12 boys) were the team's leaders for the week, picking up five gold medals between them. Miller won all three of his individual events, 50-yard butterfly (37.29), 50-yard breaststroke (44.44) and 100-yard individual medley (1:31.27), while Bonsall broke the pool records in the 50-yard and 100-yard freestyle (29.9 seconds and 1:09.96).

Both swam on the record-setting 200-yard freestyle relay (2:21.62) and the record-setting 200-yard medley relay (2:51.94) with Alec Hamilton and Gerell Miller.

The other three who took first were Powell Sieck (8 and under boys) in the 25-yard freestyle (22.49), Hagan Hoss (9-10 boys) in the 25-yard backstroke (23.24) and

Taryn Bedore (11-12 girls) in the 100 yard freestyle (1:11.37).

The other relay winners were the 8 and under boys 100-yard freestyle (Peyton Sieck, Ryan Volk, Powell Sieck and Chase Johnson) in 1:49.65, 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle (Alex Goodwin, Hagan Hoss, Drew House and Dusty Johnson) in 1:17.53 and the 9-10 mixed 100-yard medley (Devinee Borgman, Sianna Miller, Hagan Hoss and Lindsey Geeseka) in 1:49.87.

In the 8 and under girls, Borgman was second in the 50-yard freestyle (49.88) and in the 25-yard freestyle (21.02).

In 8 and under boys, Chase Johnson was second in the 50-yard freestyle (54.94) and third in the 25-yard freestyle (24.22), Peyton Sieck was second in the 25-yard freestyle (24.08) and sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (1:05.82), Powell Sieck was third in the 50-yard freestyle (59.62) and fourth in the 25-yard backstroke (37.71).

In 9-10 girls, Sianna Miller was third in the 25-yard backstroke (21.81).

In the 9-10 boys, Simon Bassett was sixth in the 25-yard backstroke (27.74), Goodwin was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:49.78), Hoss was fourth in 25-yard freestyle (17.74) and fifth in 25-yard butterfly (24.08), and Dusty Johnson was third in the 100-yard freestyle

(1:35.22), third in the 25-yard freestyle (16.93) and sixth in 25-yard breaststroke (30.14).

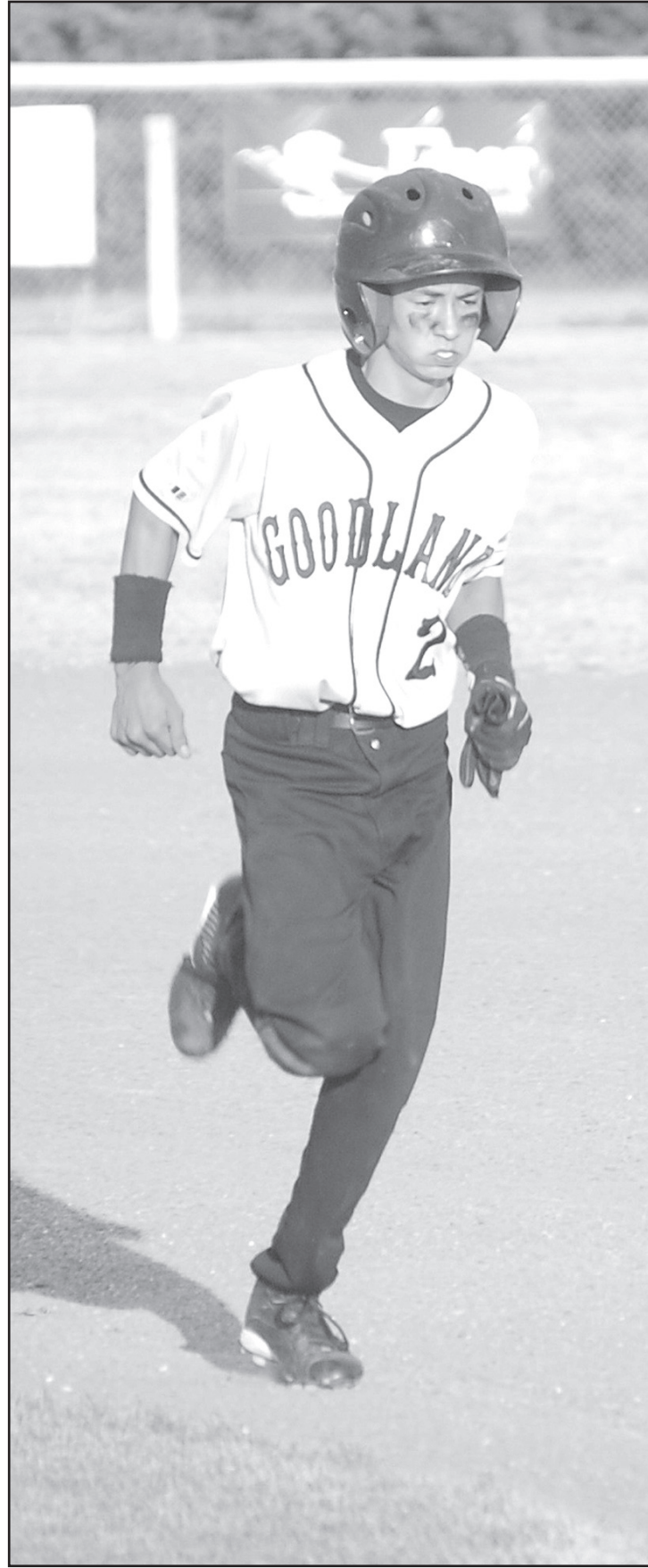
In 11-12 girls, Bedore was second in the 50-yard butterfly (36.37) and third in the 100-yard individual medley (1:27.89), Elizabeth House was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (33.31), fourth in the 50-yard breaststroke (47.53) and fifth in 100-yard freestyle (1:22.55).

In 11-12 boys, Bonsall was second in 100-yard individual medley (1:37.69), Hamilton was third in 50-yard backstroke (49.81) and 50-yard breaststroke (55.24) and was sixth in 50-yard freestyle (40.44). Gerell Miller was third in 100-yard freestyle (1:23.68) and fourth in 50-yard freestyle (37.05).

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle relay team of Bassett, Mikayla Stoffel, Sianna Miller and Geeseka was second (1:32.46), and the 11-12 girls 200-yard freestyle relay team of Bedore, Elizabeth House, Autumn Hellerud and Rachel Horney was third (2:33.08).

The 9-10 boys 100-yard medley relay team of Bassett, Goodwin, Drew House and Dusty Johnson was second (1:42.25), and the 11-12 girls 200-yard medley relay team of Hellerud, Elizabeth House, Bedore and Horney second in 3:03.18.

Other Goodland swimmers were Luke Hamilton and Gantzen Miller.

Tournament planned Saturday and Sunday

Four area American Legion teams will participate in the 10th annual Levi Hayden Memorial Baseball Tournament on Saturday and Sunday at Memorial Field in Goodland.

Games begin at noon Saturday with Scott City facing Burlington. At 2 p.m., Scott City will face Norton in the second game, and at 4 p.m., Goodland will face Norton in the third game. At 6 p.m., Goodland will face Burlington in the fourth game.

At noon on Sunday, Burlington will face Norton. At 2 p.m., Goodland faces Scott City. At 4 p.m., the teams with the worst record will play for third place, and at 6 p.m., the top two teams will play for the championship.

At the end of the tournament, coaches, umpires, a committee and the announcer will vote on the most inspirational player.

The tournament is in the memory of Levi Hayden, a Goodland High student who loved baseball. He played his final game Feb. 21, 1997, and died as result of an automobile accident that spring.

The Goodland team began the season at the Wooden Bat tournament in Plainville on Saturday and Sunday where they lost to Hoisington, 4-2 and to Ellis 9-0. Tanner

Smith placed fourth in the home run derby.

Coach John Dautel said the tournament in Plainville was a different kind because they only use wood bats. He said with the wood bats the ball speed is a little slower and gives the players a better chance to make plays.

Dautel said the team will travel to Ellis for games on Wednesday, and then go to Burlington for their tournament on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
