

Swim team wins home meet at Steever Water Park

The Goodland Swim Team was first in their home swim meet at Steever Water Park on Saturday.

It was the first home win for the team since 1993 said Coach Glenna Jarmin.

Swimmers won 14 individual events, seven relay teams were winners and three pool records were broken.

Holton Witman (11-12 boys) won three gold medals in 50-yard freestyle (29.14) new pool record, 50-yard butterfly (33.53) new pool record and 100-yard freestyle (1:12.01).

Zach Miller (11-12 boys) was a winner in the 100-yard individual medley (1:27.96) and 50-yard breaststroke (41.72) new pool record.

Holton Witman and Zach Miller teamed up with Gerell Miller and Alec Hamilton (11-12 boys) to win the 200-yard freestyle (2:23.24) and medley relay (2:51.94).

Ashleigh Woodworth (8-and under girls) and Taryn Bedore (11-12 girls) were double winners. Ashleigh Woodworth in the 25-yard butterfly (20.94) and 100-yard individual medley (1:47.25) and Bedore in the 100-yard freestyle (1:12.94) and 50-yard butterfly (34.81).

Other winners were Devinee Borgman (8-and under girls) 25-yard freestyle (20.46), Dusty Johnson (9-10 boys) 100-yard freestyle (1:33.78), Hagan Hoss (9-10 boys) 25-yard backstroke (23.14), Teneille Whitman (13-14 girls) 100-yard breaststroke (1:20.62), Riley Oharah (13-14 boys) 50-yard freestyle (26.78).

The Goodland Elks K-18 baseball team won a doubleheader over WaKeeney 8-7, 2-1, at Memorial Field Monday coming from behind in the last inning of the first game.

Goodland was down 7-1 in the fourth inning, but Goodland sent nine players to the plate and scored four runs to cut the lead to 7-5.

Neither team scored in the fifth and sixth innings.

In the top of the seventh Goodland kept WaKeeney from scoring.

Goodland Coach Dr. Gary Smith said in the bottom of the seventh Austin Avelar reached first base on a fielding error and advanced to second on a fly ball by Ryan Hillmer. Ryder Kling had a single to advance Avelar to third, and Dallas DeLaRosa hit a single up the middle allowing Avelar to score cutting the lead to 7-6.

Devon Garrett hit a ball to center loading the bases when Garth Helton hit a single and Smith said he sent Kling home and he was safe in a close play at the plate tying the game at 7-7.

Smith said Pettibone hit a pop fly, and when the catcher threw to second he sent DeLaRosa who was able to avoid the tag at home scoring the winning run, 8-7.

Smith said Avelar got on in the first inning and stole his way to third and then scored on a wild pitch to make it 2-1.

DeLaRosa was the winning pitcher in the first game striking out 11 of the 32 batters he faced. Smith said
