

Slammers team wins Hill City fastpitch tourney

The Goodland Slammers 12-and-under fastpitch softball team had to come from behind in the championship game Sunday to defeat Russell 6-5 for the title in the Hill City tournament, posting a 4-0 record.

Coach Andy Scheopner said the Slammers won in the bottom of the sixth after falling behind 5-4 when Russell scored two runs in the top of the inning.

"With one out, Carlee Cooper started our comeback with a walk," he said. "Hope Cochran grounded into a fielder's choice. Stephanie DeLaRosa, the winning pitcher, hit a double to give us runners at second and third with two outs.

"The winning hit was a triple by Berkley White, who hit it over the left fielder's head

to score the winning runs."

DeLaRosa pitched the six innings gave up 3 hits, 5 runs, 5 walks and struck out 10. She helped her team with 2 singles, a double and scored 2 runs including the winning run.

Goodland had 11 hits, including the winning triple. White had two singles, scored a run and had four runs batted in.

Cochran had two singles and scored twice. Brianna White had a single and scored a run. Megan Siruta had a single, a double and two RBIs. Lindsay Bauman had two walks, Kegan Northdorff and Carlee Cooper each had a walk and Cooper scored the tying run.

The Slammers had to get by Colby in the semifinal game, winning 4-1 in seven

innings. DeLaRosa again was the winning pitcher, going seven innings and giving up two hits and a run, walking three and striking out 11.

Goodland had three hits, all singles, and scored two runs in the second and two in the third. Colby's run came in the bottom of the seventh. Cochran, Siruta and Hernandez each had a single.

In pool play on Saturday, Goodland defeated Norton 12-5 and Stockton 8-6.

DeLaRosa got the win against Norton, going four innings and giving up five runs on five hits, walking eight and striking out six. The Slammers had 15 hits, with everyone getting at least a single, and DeLaRosa and Brianna White each had a double.

Cochran had three singles and scored two runs. DeLaRosa had two singles, a double, a walk scored two runs and had two RBIs. Berkley White had a single and scored once. Brianna White had a single, a double, scored a run and had two RBIs.

Gabby Rangel had a single, scored a run and posted an RBI. Siruta had a single and scored a run. Amber Smith had two singles, scored two runs and had an RBI. Miranda Hernandez had two singles, a run and an RBI. Bauman had a single, scored a run and had an RBI.

Stockton took a 5-1 lead in the first inning, and it was not until the bottom of the fifth that the Slammers scored five runs to win, 8-6.

Selena Acosta was the starting pitcher, but gave up a hit and five runs, walked four and had two strikeouts in the first inning. DeLaRosa came in to pitch the next four, giving up one hit and one run, walking three and 11 strikeouts.

The Slammers had nine hits, including singles by DeLaRosa, Brianna White and Smith. Rangel and Berkley White each had two singles. Brianna White and Siruta each hit a double.

The Slammers will be in Colby on Saturday and Sunday for the regional tournament and in Burlington on June 27-29 for the Thunder on the Plains tournament.

The Goodland 12-and-under baseball team swept a doubleheader in Grainfield 19-6 and 16-9 on Tuesday.

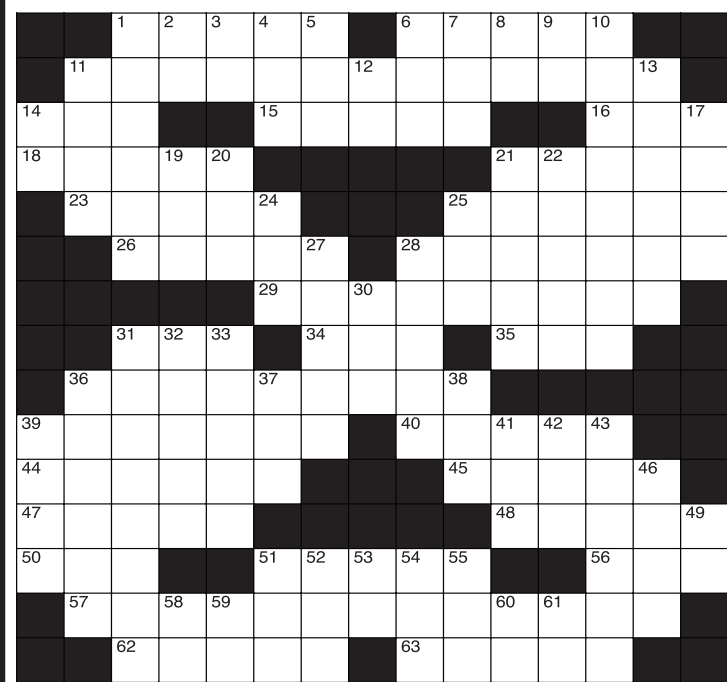
