

# Team second at Wray

The Goodland swim team took second on Saturday at a meet in Wray, Colo., where the swimmers won 10 individual events and five relays while setting a pool record.

Teneille Whitham (13-14 girls) won two gold medals in the 50-yard freestyle (27.65) and the 100-yard breaststroke, which she finished in 1 minute, 17.58 seconds, a pool record.

Holton Witman (11-12 boys) won all three of his individual events, 50-yard freestyle (30.41), 100-yard freestyle (1:09.60) and 50-yard butterfly (35.05).

Zach Miller (11-12 boys) won two races, the 50-yard breaststroke (41.18) and 100-yard individual medley (1:27.06). Both were on the winning 100-yard freestyle (2:49.05) and 200-yard medley relay (2:49.05) teams with Gerell Miller and Alec Hamilton.

Others taking first were Powell Seick (8-and under boys) 25-yard freestyle (21.75), Drew House (9-10 boys) 100-yard freestyle (1:31.65) and Taryn Bedore (11-12 girls) 50-yard butterfly (35.37).

The 9-10 boys freestyle relay took first (1:19.58) with members Alex Goodwin, Hagan Hoss, House and Dusty Johnson. The 13-14 girls won the 200-yard freestyle (2:17.40) with Abby Jolly, Chloe Goodwin, Shayley Miller, Whitham and 200-yard medley relay (2:45.27) with Brooke Lockhart, Whitham, Goodwin and Miller.

Goodland took second at the meet with 207 points. Colby was first with 236, Oberlin third, 185, Wray fourth, 172, Burlington fifth, 146.5, Holyoke sixth, 103, St. Francis seventh, 64, Flagler, Colo., eighth, 42.5, and Oakley ninth, 24.

# Junior golfers place at Hoxie

Young golfers competed in Hoxie Monday with six placing, one winning his age division, two finishing second and one third.

Goodland's junior golfers will be hosts for a tournament at 8 a.m. Thursday at Sugar Hills and will hold the area tournament Monday, June 23, at Sugar Hills.

Those who placed at Hoxie are Gage Ihrig, first among 12-13 year old boys with a 40; Gannon Ihrig second in the division with 47; Tatum Jones second among 8-9 year old boys with 67; Tanner Jones second among 16-17 year old boys with 90; Arron Artega third among 8-9 year old boys with 84; and Tyler Jones fourth among 16-17 year old boys with 92.

The area tournament will tee off at 8:30 a.m. Monday, June 23, with the 16-17 year olds and 14-15 year olds playing 18 holes, followed by the 12-13 year olds at 9 a.m., playing nine holes, and then the 10-11 and 8-9 year olds teeing off at 9:30, also playing nine holes.

Tournament organizers will modify the yardage to the hole for 8-9 year olds, moving them up to 150 yards on the par 4 holes, 200 yards to the hole on par 5 holes, and they will tee off reds on the holes that are shorter than 150.

"It should be a good tournament," said Connie Livengood, junior golf coach and organizer, "as we have always had around 60 golfers in the past, but gas prices may keep some people home."

Goodland's junior golf team has 46 members this year, she said, a great turnout for young golfers. Rae Stewart and Nathan Linin are helping coach this year, she said, and it has been fun watching the golfers improve. They are really good, she added — there are going to be a lot of great future golfers.
