

Goodland grads win Sweet Swinger

A pair of Goodland High graduates were the overall winners of the Sweet Swinger Golf Tournament held June 12-14 at Sugar Hills Golf Club.

Brent Linin of Goodland and Dave Jones of Cleveland, Ohio, both 1965 Goodland grads, won w playoff among winners of the nine flights to take the championship. Linin and his wife Ginny farm in Sherman County, while Jones, who formerly played for the Cleveland Browns, owns JIT Packaging in Aurora, Ohio.

Jones grew up on a farm near Kanorado and played six-man football in Kanorado in the ninth grade. His father bought a house in Goodland and he went to Goodland High to play 11-man football.

He got a Bachelor of Arts in physical education and teaching while playing football at Kansas State University and

married Elaine Eye, also from Goodland, his senior year.

He was drafted by the Cleveland Browns in the 11th round of the 1968 National Football League draft and signed a three-year contract. He was number 41 with the Browns, playing on the punt return team.

In 1985, he started the packaging firm, which he said has five operations in Ohio, one in Pennsylvania and one in Georgia. His sons, Jeff and Josh, run the business, which makes and distributes packaging supplies.

Jones and his wife run the financial end from their home in Sarasota, Fla., where they live for eight months of the year.

Good weather draws more cars to speedway

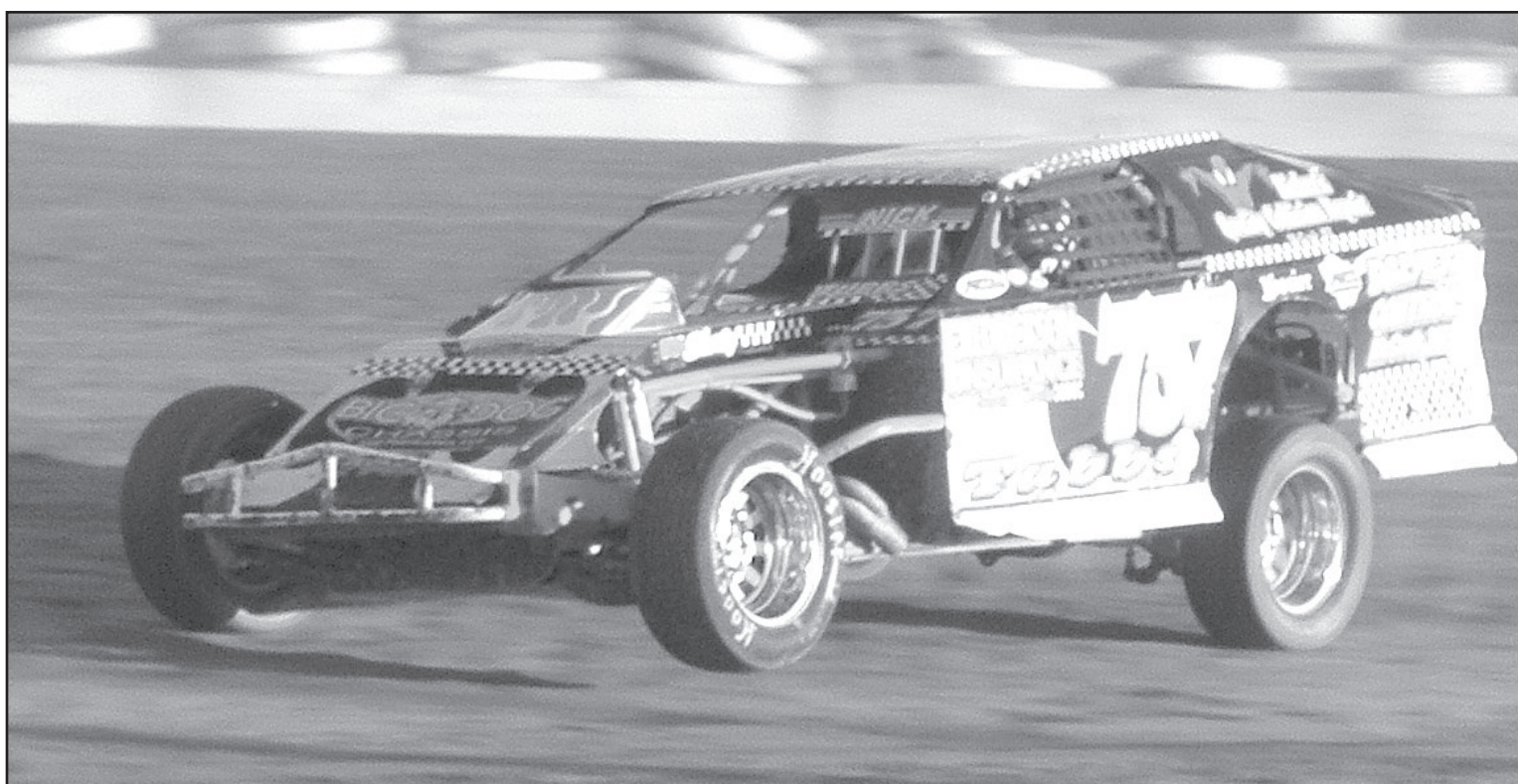
Two new cars joined the mini stock competition, driven by Dwayne Bowman (61x) of Syracuse and David Guinn (61) of Dodge City.

Marshall Hoppe (11H) of Goodland took third and Tom D. Nelson Jr. (34N) of Aurora, Colo. fourth. The stock class added a couple of cars, with Nelson and the return of Wheat Lippleman of Colby.

In the IMCA modified class, the numbers were back up a bit, with Nick Tubbs (737) out running Brady Coen (3) of Wiley, Colo., to win the main event. Tubbs won the opening night main, finishing eighth on May 10 when the Blood, Sweat and Tears cars from Colorado were at the speedway and second on May 17.

John Fose (27) of WaKeeney was third and Mark Zorn (21z) of Russell fourth.

The Sherman County Racing Association recently elected Tom Colby president and Dale Davis vice president. Patsy Gresty continues as secretary and Sandy Miller is the press secretary. Travis King is the sergeant at arms and Lane Linthacum track supervisor.
