

Goodland swimmers second at Colby meet

The Goodland Swim Team was edged out by the Colby Swim Club at the meet in Colby on Saturday, 272 to 268, with Goodland taking second place with 16 swimmers and eight relay team taking first in their events.

Teneille Whitham (13-14 girls) won the 50-yard freestyle at 27.23 seconds and set a pool record in the 100-yard breaststroke at 1 minute, 4.73 seconds.

Three swimmers won all three of their races:

- Taryn Bedore (11-12 girls) in the 50-yard freestyle (29.44), 100-yard freestyle (1:10.31) and 50-yard butterfly (34.24).
- Ian Bonsall (11-12 boys) in the 50 yard freestyle (29.82), 100-yard freestyle (1:08.61) and 200-yard freestyle (2:34.33).
- Holton Witman (11-12 boys) in the 50-yard backstroke (38.34), 50-yard butterfly (32.40) and 100-yard individual medley (1:19.19).

Powell Sieck (8-and under boys) won gold medals for the 25-yard freestyle (21.47) and 50-yard freestyle (50.61).

Others winning a race were Drew House (9-10 boys) 100-yard freestyle (1:25.17), Elizabeth House (11-12 girls) tied 50-yard breaststroke (41.49) and Zach Miller (11-12 boys) 50-yard breaststroke (39.96).

Goodland Legion team loses two to Colby

The Goodland American Legion team ran into a well prepared Colby team Wednesday losing a doubleheader 16-1 and 8-0.

The two games lasted a combined nine innings. Colby pounded out 20 hits and their two starting pitchers, Brandon Rasmussen and Levi Schlick, limited Goodland to just one hit and one run. Schlick threw a five-inning no-hitter in game two and Rasmussen was one out from a no-hitter in the first game until giving up a bloop single to Kuter Isaac with two outs in the fourth.

Goodland was coming off a doubleheader in Hays Saturday where Goodland won the first game 12-10, but lost the second 6-5.

The Colby pitching was dominant Wednesday and the offense was head and shoulders better against the same two Goodland pitchers, Brandon Rome and Preston Dautel, who they struggled against on April 29.

Schlick's no-hitter against Goodland followed what was previously his best start of the summer on June 18, when he limited Hays to just a run and four hits.

Schlick struck out six, walked just two and didn't allow a Goodland runner to get past second base Wednesday.

There wasn't anything complin game one, Colby took an early 2-0 lead in the first inning, added five in the second and blew the game wide open with a nine-run third inning.

Rome lasted only into the second inning and was replaced by Isaac, who gave up two runs in third before being removed for Teather Dautel.

Teather Dautel committed one of Goodland's six errors on a bouncer back to the mound that led to two Colby runs. He then proceeded to give up three straight hits before retiring Cory Sager to end the inning.

By that point, Colby led 16-0 and only Isaac's bloop single in the fourth scoring Rory Kling broke up the shutout and the no-hitter.

It would be Goodland's only hit of the night.

Colby's offense set the tone right away with four runs in the first inning.

Preston Dautel suffered the loss for Goodland after allowing all eight runs in four innings.

The Goodland team will try to get back on the winning track at 5 p.m. on Monday when they face WaKeeny on the road.

The American Legion will be at home for a tournament on Saturday and Sunday, July 5-6 at Memorial Field. The games will begin at noon each day with the championship game to be played at 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Teams coming for the tournament include Wiley and Granada, Colo. and Plainville.

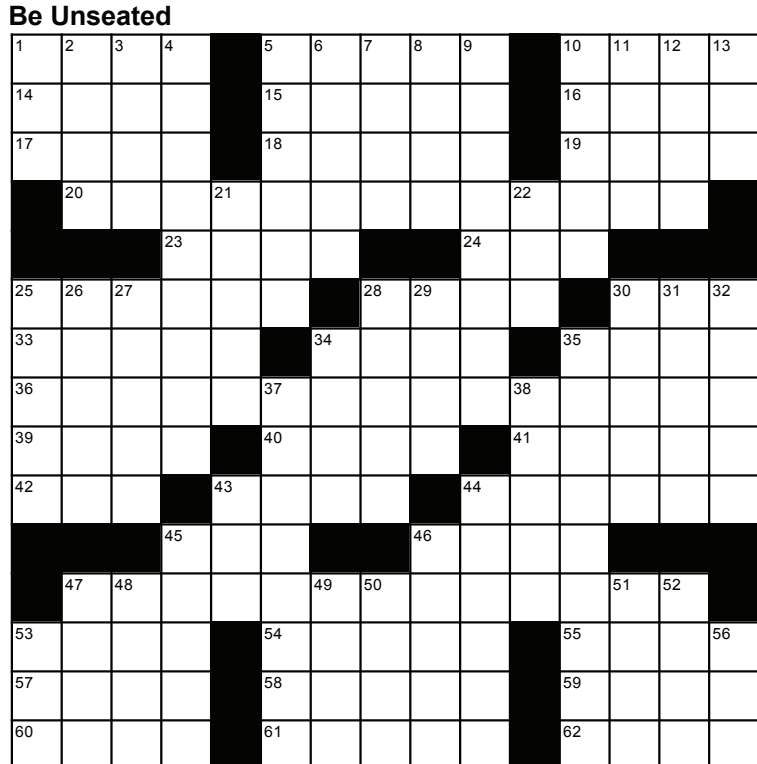
