Slice of Life raises \$75,000

Nearly 40 teams competed in the Slice of Life Golf Tournament, raising money for the Northwest Kansas Medical Foundation to benefit Goodland Regional Medical Center Saturday.

With 38 teams of three, 114 golfers were vying for flag prizes and hole-in-one prizes, but no one won the hole-in-one prizes of \$10,000 on No. 8, free use of a Ford F-150 pickup for two years at No. 2 or the Walter Hagan iron and woods at No. 10.

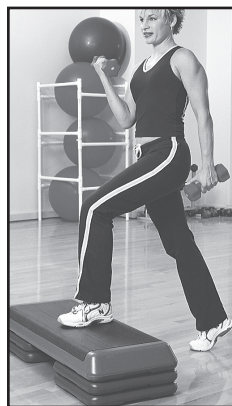

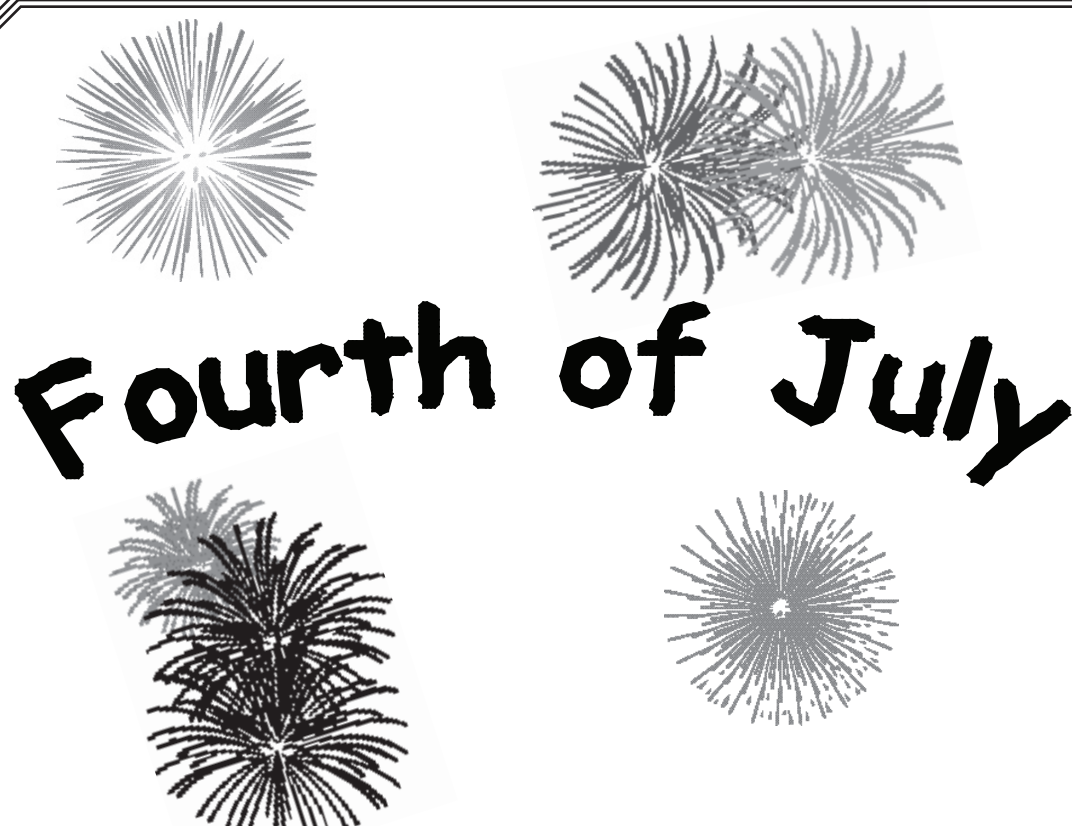
