We normally see

The larvae of "masked chafers" are the annual white grubs we see in our lawns. On average, eggs deposited by beetles hatch in 10-14 days. Grub development is relatively rapid. By mid to late September, third instar larvae voraciously feed on grass roots, causing visible damage to turf.

In situations where perfect stands of turf are expecte, now through mid-July is the optimal time to apply preventative insecticides. The active ingredients, imidacloprid and halofenozide, have proven effec-


