

Suspects lead officers on chase ends with crash

reported in serious condition on Monday and Horne was in good condition.

A third person, Raven Frayre, 24, was being held in the Kit Carson County Jail on a warrant hold from Thomas County.

Lt. Greg Jirak of Oakley, the Kansas Highway Patrol supervisor on duty, said he followed the chase to Burlington and worked with the Colorado patrol and Burlington officers to investigate the accident.

Jirak when Burlington officers did an inventory of the van's contents, they found credit cards with Stephens' name one then.

Jirak said a question came up later about who would be responsible for security of the two prisoners being flown to Denver. Saying the patrol did not have jurisdiction, he referred the question to Thomas County. Baughn said he has an agreement with Denver Police to watch the suspects while they are in Denver.

Sheriff Baughn said Stephens was treated at Citizens Medical Center in Colby.

Trooper Allan Lytton of Hays said the minivan was reported stolen out of South Carolina and that two of the three were wanted on charges out of South Carolina. He said the driver was being charged by the highway patrol with driving under the influence.

Sheriff Baughn said all the charges have not been filed, but should be completed early this week.

Goodland wins Oakley meet

Goodland swimmers won 21 gold medals and set two pool records Saturday, leading the Goodland Swim Team to a first-place finish at the Oakley meet.

Goodland earned 256 points for the win. Colby was second with 227 and Oberlin third with 213.5. Burlington had 150, Holyoke, Colo., 115.5, Wray 108, St. Francis 74, Flagler, Colo., 56 and Oakley 48.

Ashleigh Woodworth (8 and under girls) won all three of her races, the 25-yard backstroke, 25-yard butterfly and 100-yard individual medley. Holton Witman (11-12 boys) won all of his events, the 50-yard freestyle, 50-yard butterfly (setting a pool record) and 100-yard individual medley.

Taryn Bedore (11-12 girls) won two gold medals in the 100-yard freestyle and 50-yard butterfly. Teneille Whitham (13-14 girls) won the 50-yard freestyle and set a pool record in the 100-yard breaststroke.

Others winning were Devinee Borgmann (8 and under girls) in the 50-yard freestyle; Powell Sieck (8 and under boys) 50-yard freestyle; Hagan Hoss (9-10 boys), 25-yard backstroke; Drew House (9-10 boys), 100-yard freestyle; Zach Miller (11-12 boys), 50-yard breaststroke; and Ian Bonsall (11-12 boys), 100-yard freestyle.

Relay winners were the 8 and under girls in the 100-yard freestyle, 8 and under boys A-team 100-yard freestyle, 11-12 boys 200-yard medley, 8 and under mixed 100-yard medley and the 11-12 boys 200-yard medley.

The team has this weekend off for the Fourth of July and will be in Burlington for the Northwest Kansas Swim League Championships July 11 and 12.

In 8 and under girls: Borgmann finished the 50-yard freestyle in 47.69 seconds for the win, finished the 25-yard freestyle in 20.19 seconds for second and the 25-yard breaststroke in 26.73 for second.

Mikayla Stoffel finished the 25-yard breaststroke in 30.96 for sixth, and Rachel Witman finished the 25-yard breaststroke in 29.46 for fifth.

Woodworth finished the 25-yard backstroke in 23.24, the 25-yard butterfly in 21.07 and the 100-yard individual medley in 1 minute, 51.84 seconds, for her three wins.

In 8 and under boys, Chase Johnson finished the 25-yard freestyle in 23.97 seconds for second, the

50-yard freestyle in 59.72 for fifth and the 25-yard butterfly in 49.39 for fifth.

Peyton Sieck was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle in 57.62 seconds and in the 25-yard freestyle in 24.18. Powell Sieck won the 50-yard freestyle in 52.62, was third in the 25-yard freestyle in 24.05 and fifth in the 25-yard backstroke in 31.86.

Devin Tipping was third in the 50-yard freestyle in 56.76 and fifth in the 25-yard freestyle in 26.14.

In 9-10 girls, Kelsey White was fifth in the 25-yard backstroke in 22.87 seconds and in the 25-yard butterfly in 22.18.

In 9-10 boys, Simon Bassett was sixth in the 25-yard breaststroke in 29.37. Alex Goodwin was fourth in the 25-yard breaststroke in 28.27 and sixth in the 25-yard backstroke in 27.96.

Hoss finished the 25-yard backstroke in 22.54 for the win, was second in the 100-yard freestyle in 1:32.72 and fifth in the 25-yard butterfly in 23.78.

House finished the 100-yard freestyle in 1:31.28 for the win, was third in the 25-yard butterfly in 22.45 and fourth in the 25-yard freestyle in 17.84.

Dusty Johnson was third in the 25-yard freestyle in 17.78 and in the 100-yard individual medley in 2:02.17 and sixth in the 25-yard butterfly in 26.58.

In 11-12 girls, Bedore won the 100-yard freestyle in 1:09.5 and the 50-yard butterfly in 34.02. She took second in the 50-yard freestyle in 31.25.

Elizabeth House was third in the 50-yard breaststroke in 43.09 and fifth in the 100-yard freestyle in 1:23.24.

In 11-12 boys, Bonsall won the 100-yard freestyle in 1:09.87, was second in the 50-yard freestyle in 30.84 and third in the 50-yard backstroke in 42.45.

Alec Hamilton took fourth in the 50-yard breaststroke in 53.07 and sixth in the 50-yard freestyle in 39.33 and the 50-yard backstroke in 53.01.

Gerrell Miller finished third in the 50-yard breaststroke in 45.81 and fourth in the 100-yard freestyle in 1:24.33 and the 50-yard backstroke in 45.44.

Zach Miller won the 50-yard breaststroke in 42.44 and placed second in the 50-yard butterfly in 36.93 and the 100-yard individual medley in 1:25.98.

Holton Witman won the 50-yard

freestyle in 29.27, the 50-yard butterfly in 32.40 and the 100-yard individual medley in 1:21.87, setting a pool record in the butterfly.

In 13-14 girls, Chloe Goodwin finished fifth in the 100-yard freestyle in 1:15.65. Abby Jolly was second in the 400-yard freestyle in 5:47.84 and third in the 50-yard freestyle in 31.58 and the 100-yard backstroke in 1:24.25.

Brooke Lockhart was fourth in the 400-yard freestyle in 6:37.63, and Shayley Miller was sixth in the 400-yard freestyle in 6:55.58. Whitham won the 50-yard freestyle in 28.38 and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:18.78. She set a pool record in the breaststroke.

In 15-18 girls, Amber Webster took sixth in the 100-yard freestyle in 1:31.42, in the 50-yard freestyle in 38.63 and in the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:38.52.

In the relays, the 8 and under girls 100-yard freestyle team of Brooklyn Woodworth, Rachel Witman, Ashleigh Woodworth and Borgmann took first in 1:42.25.

In 8 and under boys, the 100-yard freestyle relay A of Powell Sieck, Ryan Volk, Peyton Sieck and Chase Johnson finished in 1:46.92.

The B team of Tipping, Gantzen Miller, Cooper Woodworth and Luke Hamilton took fourth in 2:26.82.

In 9-10 girls, the 100-yard freestyle relay team of Sianna Miller, Amanda Coon, Kelsey White and Kinsey Volk finished fourth in 1:25.26.

The 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle team of Drew House, Dusty Johnson, Hoss and Bassett placed second in 1:17.99.

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle relay team of Alex Goodwin,

Peri Sieck, Lindsey Geeseka and Mikayla Stoffel came in third in 1:39.03.

In the 11-12 girls 200-yard freestyle relay, Taryn Bedore, Elizabeth House, Makala Fogg and Savannah Bassett took second in 2:44.94.

In the 11-12 boys 200-yard freestyle relay, Bonsall, Alec Hamilton, Gerell Miller and Holton Witman won in 2:21.77.

In 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay, Zach Miller, Shayley Miller, Brooke Lockhart and Chloe Goodwin snared third in 2:31.06.

In 8 and under girls 100-yard medley, Rachel Witman, Brooklyn Woodworth, Ashleigh Woodworth and Rebecca Lockhart placed fourth in 2:34.97. In the 8 and under mixed 100-yard medley, Cooper Woodworth, Borgmann, Ryan Volk and Luke Hamilton won in 3:10.59.

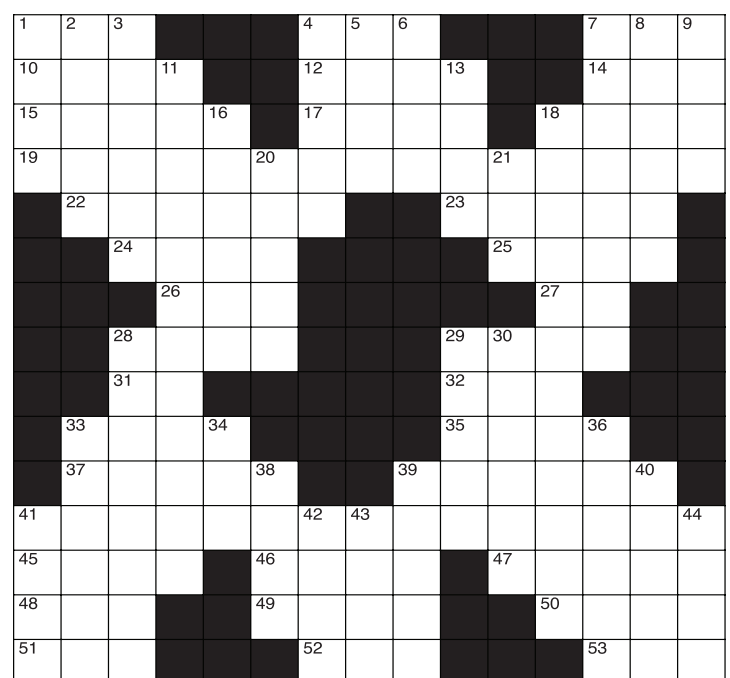
