

Addison and Aiden most popular names for babies

The most popular names for newborns in Kansas for 2007 were Addison for girls and Aiden for boys. For the second year both top names were not associated with a gender. The other top four most popular names for girls were Emma, Madison, Ava and Hailey. The only new one in the top 10

was Isabella. Avery entered the top 25 for the first time, along with Alyssa and Chloe. Kaylee had 31 different spellings. Aiden had been the most popular name for a boy for the past four years. Jacob, in the top spot for nine years until 2004, remained at num-

ber five, behind Kaden, Ethan and Jackson. Kaden had the most spelling variations and the spelling with the K was the most popular. The trend for Celtic and biblical boys' names continues with Aiden, Brayden, Conner, Gavin, Kaden, Logan, Caleb, Daniel, Ethan, Isaac, Jacob, Joshua, Joseph, Noah and

Samuel. The only new name in the top 10 was Christopher. Gavin was the only new name in the top 25. The lists were prepared by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health's Center for Health and Environmental Statistics. The department got the names

from birth certificate information. The top 25 names for girls were Addison, Emma, Madison, Ava, Hailey, Emily, Abigail, Katelyn, Kaylee, Isabella, Olivia, Elizabeth, Rylee, Hannah, Sophia, Mackenzie, Madelyn, Alyssa, Chloe, Alexis, Mia, Brianna, Brooklyn, Lily and Avery.

The top 25 names for boys were Aiden, Kaden, Ethan, Jackson, Jacob, Jayden, Brayden, Alexander, Christopher, Logan, Noah, Landon, William, Andrew, Samuel, Michael, Gavin, Tyler, Joshua, Caleb, Isaac, Daniel, Connor, Mason and Nicholas.

State offers scholarships to agritourism businesses

The Kansas Department of Commerce has \$25,000 in scholarships for prospective owners to attend a conference or go on an educational tour of agritourism businesses, available for anyone interested in starting or expanding a business in the field. Dates to apply are Wednesday, Oct. 1; Thursday, Jan. 1; and Wednesday, April 1. Anyone who has registered with the Kansas Department of Commerce for the agritourism registration program can apply. Even if you have applied

before, you are eligible to apply again. One conference could be the North American Farm Direct Marketing Association annual conference or workshops in Georgia in February, with bus tours, workshops, speakers and opportunity for networking. Others could be the state agritourism or tourism conferences and the Maize Company conference. Tours could allow business people to see other agritourism businesses in the region or nation. For example,

representatives of Klaumeyer's Dairy in southcentral Kansas visited Cagle's Dairy in Georgia two years ago to learn how they had built up their operation, what worked and what might work for in Kansas.
