Roland McDaniel

Roland Noyce McDaniel, 73, Loveland, Colo., formerly of Goodland, died on Sunday, July 13, 2008, in Loveland.

He was born Sept. 29, 1934, to Ruth (Noyce) and Floyd M. McDaniel in Goodland and attended school in here, graduating in 1952. He was class president for four years and on the wrestling team. Mr. McDaniel earned a degree in mechanical engineering from Kansas State University and worked for the Pratt and Whitney Aircraft Co. He was one of the engineers who developed the J57 jet engine still in service today. Later, he worked for Westinghouse Corp. in Baltimore. While there, he received a master's degree in mechanical engineering and aeronautics from George Washington University. For the last 20 years of his career, he was a nuclear field engineer with Cyprus Minerals in Tucson. Mr. McDaniel loved running and completed 47 marathons. He married Maxine (M. Kay) Opp on April 17, 1988, in Tucson. In 2006 he retired and he and his wife moved

to Loveland, where he built their home.
