Kinsey said her mom sews mainly to fix things.


The duo said they have been participating in the summer reading program at the Goodland Public library and practicing for the Goodland swim team.


Kinsey will be in the fourth grade at Central Elementary School next year and Ryan will be in the second grade at West Elementary School.

Fairgrounds gets a variety of upgrades

ntbetz@nwkansas.com A small group of people from the Sherman County Fair Board and the home owned carnival have been working on projects at the fairgrounds for several months getting ready for the fair.

The Northwest Kansas District Free Fair starts this week and runs through next week, and fair goers will find a variety of improvements to the buildings and grounds of the Sherman County fairgrounds.

In the past year the fair board with the help of the Sherman County commissioners have improved the 4-H building with a new floor and new toilets including a handicapped one for each restroom.

The bathrooms got a fresh coat of paint last week thanks to Colleen Duell with green for the men and a shade of pink for the ladies.

A used swamp cooler was installed in the south kitchen area by Steve and Adam Duell, Art Hatfield. Steve Duell said some additional electrical work would be done to hook up a steam

in that kitchen.

In March, Steve Duell, fair board chairman, with the help of his son Adam and farmers Scott Jarrett and Art Hatfield erected a section of new steel fence from the 4-H building to the south end of the fairgrounds.

Inside the Agriculture Building the corner area — where the fair board and 4-H had an open office area — has been enclosed and an office created with a door that can be secured.

The county commissioners approved replacement of the lower part of the roof and , and had the leaks fixed in the bottoms of the swamp coolers. Additional electrical work was done in the Ag Building and over at the livestock barns.

A new wash rack has been built on the east side of the livestock building to give the goats a place to be washed separate from the steers.

On the west side of the livestock barn an expanded dog agility course has been built because of additional jumps that had to be added, and there was not enough room in the indoor arena. The dog show was held on Saturday morning, and the obedience and showmanship competitions were held in the indoor arena. Over at the home owned carnival two new rides were previewed at the July 4 Freedom Fest including a centrifugal force ride like a "Gravitron" and a kids train ride that was built in France.

Brad Schields, a carnival committee member, thanked the commissioners in April for the new road out to the carnival building. He said someone is donating some light poles to go along the trees on the north side, and they were installed and in operation by July 4 to help light the parking area on the south side of the fairgrounds.

He said Brad Schick of the carnival ride committee had to find some parts for the Space Train kids ride from France.

The carnival workers have been using the new building to their advantage over the past winter, and refurbished and painted the tilt-a-whirl chairs, the carousel and the Lions Club ride with the help of Kevin Bauman of KB Body and Paint who painted the seats for the carnival committee and his wife Cara of Vinyl Design who did the vinyl lettering and stars for the seats.

Steve Duell said he was proud of the work done by the volunteers to help make the fair and carnival better every year.
