

# Runners finish in good time, place low

Goodland had the fourth-place runner among freshman and sophomore boys at the Greeley County Invitational cross country meet Saturday, but the Cowboys finished at the bottom of eight teams.

The Cowgirls' one runner finished 15th in the junior and senior girls race and 27th overall out of 37 runners. The Grant Junior High Lady Mustangs had the 13th, 16th and 22nd place runners out of 23, and the Mustangs finished 21st, 26th and 30th out of 33.

"Our times were good at Greeley County," said Coach Richard Schwasinger, "but our places weren't. A lot of the runners there do a lot of running in the summer, and ours just didn't put in those kinds of hours."

The Cowboys missed senior Simon Grunfeld, the coach said, but he had an opportunity to go to the State Fair — he's an AFS exchange student, and it was nice for him to get to go.

Sophomore Stephen Buller was fourth among freshman and sophomore boys, finishing the 5,000-meter run in 19 minutes, 42.38 seconds. He was 16th in the

overall rankings. Sophomore Michael Pettibone was 28th among freshmen and sophomores and 53rd overall in 22:55.09. Freshman Corey Davis was 35th among freshmen and sophomores and 68th overall in 29:18.56.

Among junior and senior boys, junior Ben Waugh was 23rd out of 33 runners, finishing in 21 minutes, 40.25 seconds. Junior Ryan Irvin was 29th among juniors and seniors in 25:06.53 and was 58th overall.

Right behind Irvin was senior Justin Verlinden in 25:17.75 for 30th among juniors and seniors and 59th overall. Junior J.P. McCool finished in 26:20.91 for 31st among juniors and seniors and 64th overall, and senior T.J. Freeman finished in 29:16.56 for 33rd among juniors and seniors and 67th overall.

Senior Cassie Cooper was the only Cowgirls runner in the 4,000-meter race. She finished in 22 minutes, 50.79 seconds.

Since five runners are needed for a team score, the Cowgirls didn't have a score. Greeley County (Tribune) won the girls race with 20 points, Lakin was second with 41, Johnson third with 51 and Leoti fourth with 75.

The Cowboys were eighth with 114 points. Ness City won the boys race with 22 points, Greeley County was second with 32, Scott City third with 42, Johnson fourth with 51, Lakin fifth with 68, Baca sixth with 91 and Leoti seventh with 111.

Goodland was scheduled to compete at 3 p.m. Thursday in Oakley. The boys will essentially have their junior varsity team plus Grunfeld, Schwasinger said, and Cassie Cooper will run for the girls. They can only compete in eight meets a year, he said, so they all have to sit out one.

Everyone will be running at 2:45 p.m. Tuesday in Ulysses, he said.

For Grant Junior High, eighth grader Chantel Coates was 13th in the girls race, finishing the 1,600-meter run in 8 minutes, 5.72 seconds. Seventh grader Ashleigh Borders was 16th in 8:26.78, and seventh grader Taylor Ratcliff was 22nd in 10:49.66.

In the boys race, only seventh graders ran for Goodland. Ace Artega was 21st in 7:15.78, Jesse Cooper 26th in 8:12.16 and Jarod Lake 30th in 8:39.52.

"I was very impressed with our showing on Saturday morning," said Junior High

Coach Ben Foust. "Although we didn't come home with any medals, we improved and learned a little more about competing and racing."

There were 23 runners from seven schools, he said — Wichita County (Leoti), Tribune, Baca County, Colo., Johnson, Christian Family Education and Lakin, besides Grant Junior High.

Gloria Bustillos ran about a quarter of a mile, the coach said, but did not finish the race.

"She did exactly what I told her to," he said — "go out hard and run fast. She is still working on getting in shape after recently being cleared to run. I'm proud of her effort."

Coates improved her time by more than 10 seconds, Foust said, and is running faster than she did all last year. It was Borders' first meet, he said, adding that she did well in her first showing.

"I'm looking for big things from her throughout the year," Foust said.

This was also Ratcliff's first race, he said; she has been experiencing some ankle pain but stuffed it inside, ran hard and finished ahead of one girl and one boy.

"I was very pleased that no one (from Goodland) finished last," Foust said.

On the boys' side, the coach said, Artega had a fairly rough day in his second race. Some people respond well to morning races after having afternoon practices, Foust said, and some people don't — Artega is one who didn't.

"He gave his best," the coach said, "and I'm proud of him for it. I'm sure he'll do even better at McCook on Friday."

Greeley County was Lake's second race as well, Foust said; he improved his time by over 15 seconds. He continues to push himself in practice and work hard, the coach said, and it's showing up in his racing.

Saturday was Cooper's first race, Foust said; he has worked hard in practice and has a rough start to the season with an illness.

"I was very happy with his place and time for his first race," the coach said. "He has tons of talent and will be a huge asset to the team."

Goodland was missing a few athletes this weekend, Foust said, adding he hopes to have everyone eligible and healthy for the next meet at 4:30 p.m. today in McCook.
