

Physically Eicher has been struggling it on the agriculture of the area. She painted since she was hit by lightening at age 16.

School she had a ruptured appendix. At 25 she had a ruptured gall bladder and at 30 her liver quit. At age 58 she and her husband were in the process of moving to the Wamego area when she went down. She had massive bleeding on the brain. After four surgeries in two weeks the doctors found an aneurism. While at rehab she had a double stroke which left her with no feeling from her chest on down.

In rehab they helped her train her motor nerves so she had movement in her legs and arms.

Jokingly she said she never lost her ability to talk.

Eicher said her husband has redone their home to make it accessible for her wheel chair.

She said, "I dream it and my husband does it.'

She said she has been battling multiple sclerosis and its attempt to slow her down. Eicher said that her faith has been a source of strength for her.

The couple has three children, Michelle Preston, pharmacist at Goodland WalMart, Rich Eicher, an engineer for Henderson Engineers in Dallas and Pete Eicher, an overseer of steel and metal fabrication of Wescon in Wichita and six grandchildren/

Eicher said her next project was revitalizing the Christmas decorations for the poles on main street.
