Senior Chelsie Gausman finished the nine holes in 44 strokes. Sophomore Kirsten Topliff came in fourth in 51, junior Amber Douglas seventh in 52 and sophomore Katlyn Topliff 11th in 58. Sophomore Andrea Roeder finished with a 65 and junior Ashley Garza in 66.

The Cowgirls had a team score of 205. Second was Holcomb with 223, Syracuse third with 229, Lakin fourth with 229, and Colby and Sublette tied for fifth with 286.

"I thought the girls played exceptionally well considering the weather at Buffalo Dunes," said Coach Connie Livengood. "The girls all improved their scores from the last time that we played the course two weeks ago.'

Gausman's 44, the coach said, was a good score for the conditions, and she was more focused than earlier in the season. Kirsten Topliff shot a 51, which is a good score for her, Livengood said, adding that Topliff can get down to the 40s by making fewer putts.

Douglas has stayed very consistent this year, the coach said, but she can also cut off a few more strokes.

"Katlyn Topliff played about the same," Livengood said, "but I was did very well as the junior varsity


