## Golfers win on road

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The Cowgirls had the top golfer and won the Holcomb High Girls Invitational Golf Tournament on Thursday at Buffalo Dunes Golf Course in Garden City.

Senior Chelsie Gausman finished the nine holes in 44 strokes. Sophomore Kirsten Topliff came in fourth in 51, junior Amber Douglas seventh in 52 and sophomore Katlyn Topliff 11th in 58. Sophomore Andrea Roeder finished with a 65 and junior Ashley Garza in 66.

The Cowgirls had a team score of 205. Second was Holcomb with 223, Syracuse third with 229, Lakin fourth with 229, and Colby and Sublette tied for fifth with 286.

"I thought the girls played exceptionally well considering the weather at Buffalo Dunes," said Coach Connie Livengood. "The girls all improved their scores from the last time that we played the course two weeks ago."

Gausman's 44, the coach said, was a good score for the conditions, and she was more focused than earlier in the season. Kirsten Topliff shot a 51, which is a good score for her, Livengood said, adding that Topliff can get down to the 40s by making fewer putts.

Douglas has stayed very consistent this year, the coach said, but she can also cut off a few more strokes.

"Katlyn Topliff played about the same," Livengood said, "but I was

pleased with her score."

Roeder played the course pretty well, the coach said, considering she had not played there before.

"We are going to work on her putting," she added.

Garza played well, Livengood said, and she improved her score from last time. Senior Sam Erickson and sophomore Jacquelynn Gulley did very well as the junior varsity players, the coach said, Erickson

shooting a 66 and Gulley a 74.

"As a team," Livengood said, "we need to adjust to the faster greens on the approach shots and putting. I felt that we had a better team effort at this tournament than the last couple of tournaments that we have played in."

Holcomb and Lakin did not have their full teams, she said, so the scores will be deceiving later on at the tournaments.

"We will know next week for sure where we go to regionals," she said, "but I am confident that we are going to go to Ulysses. It's getting to the final stage of golf and tournaments, and we need to start playing better golf and peak during these last few tournaments."

The Cowgirls were scheduled to play at 9 a.m. this morning at Ulysses and at 2 p.m. Thursday in Oakley.

## Cowgirls beat Ulysses, Holcomb

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The Cowgirls volleyball team won matches with Ulysses and Holcomb and gave Class 6A state qualifier Dodge City a run for their money at a home quadrangular Thursday.

In varsity action, Goodland beat the Ulysses Tigers 25-16, 25-22 and the Holcomb Lady Longhorns 25-19, 8-25, 15-8.

The Cowgirls lost to the Lady Demons 25-23, 25-15 after taking an early lead in the first game. The two teams went back and forth in scoring, with Goodland holding the lead most of the game.

In the second game, Dodge City scored first, but the Cowgirls kept pace in the early stages. The Lady Demons pushed forward, however, to a 10-point lead. Goodland fought back, but Dodge City got to 25 before the Cowgirls could get a good run going.

In junior varsity action, the Cowgirls lost all their matches but kept the scoring close, with Ulysses winning 26-24, 10-25, 15-11; Dodge City 25-17, 27-25; and Holcomb 25-19, 8-25, 15-8.

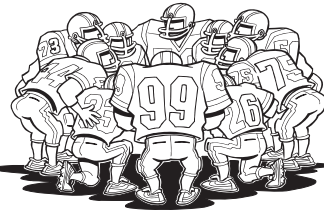

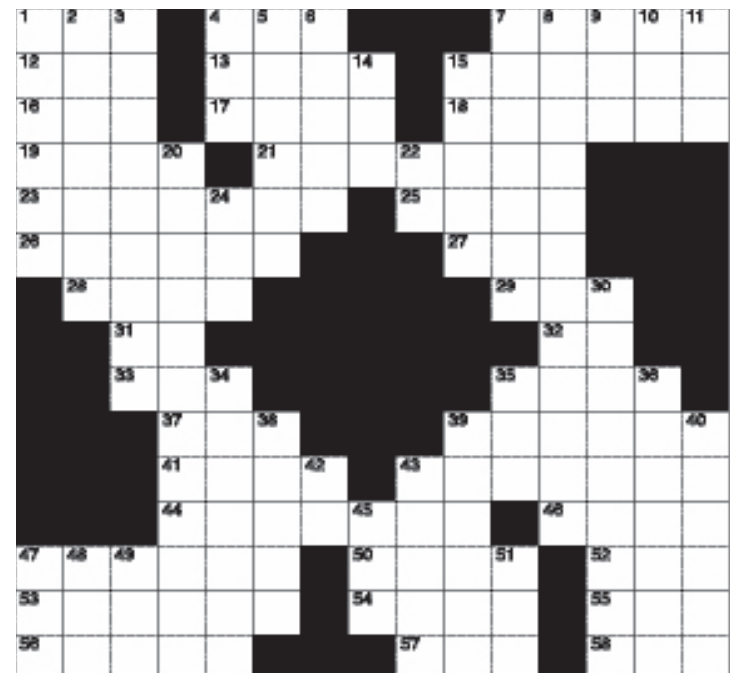
