## Huge plays + massive yards = 35-24 win

slcorcoran@nwkansas.com It was a heart-stopping, jawdropping game as the Goodland High School Cowboys used huge plays and a lot of offensive vards to out-pace the Rawlins County Buffaloes Friday in Atwood.

Rawlins County got the first score, but Goodland was not to be outdone, and senior quarterback Travis Angelos used big plays to fuel drives and get the Cowboys on the scoreboard. Goodland won 35-24 after a back and forth war of momentum with the Buffaloes that ended with an interception.

Angelos ran for 215 yards and passed for 137. Senior Fernando Martinez ran for 159 yards. Senior Brandon Rome had 342 yards as a receiver, and freshman Riley Oharah had 118, sophomore Brock Wilkens 116, Martinez 54, sophomore Kelly Pearson 36 and sophomore Nathan Deeds 34.

"Without a doubt, the win was awesome," said Coach Kent Teeter. "We really had to work for it, which makes us a better team. Each time they scored, we responded quickly to get a score ourselves. I thought it was a really hard-fought game by both teams. It was a really fun game.

"I am very pleased with our offense. Atwood's defensive game plan was to not give up any big plays in the passing game, and our offense adjusted to running the ball more this week. Our offensive line did a great job of opening up some big holes, and Travis and Fernando had some big runs.

"We gave them some offensive formations that they hadn't seen on film yet, which really helped in the running game. Our offense has a ton of options, and we are still working on getting better at what we have in and are slowing adding some things each week.

"Our execution is also getting better each week. We also don't know how teams will play us defensively, so we won't know from game to game if they are trying to take away the passing game or the running game."

Defensively, the Cowboys didn't play as well as last week, Teeter said; Atwood gave them more things to defend, and that gave the guys some problems.

"We didn't always have players where they needed to be based on Oharah. Goodland got a penalty the Buffaloes were given half the Goodland at third and nine. A Goodland penalty brought them back to second and 12 with just over two minutes remaining in the game.

At third and six. Martinez ran and lunged forward for the first down, refusing to be taken down. The measurement showed he made it.

"Even though we didn't play perfect, we played really hard," Teeter said. "Our effort was great and our execution and enthusiasm decent. It's really nice to play a game like that and walk away with a win. We couldn't have done that a few weeks ago, which shows how much we are improving.

"We are still a team that can still improve, and it's really exciting to see how things are starting to come into place. If we are willing to continue to work hard and learn, we will continue to show improvement."
