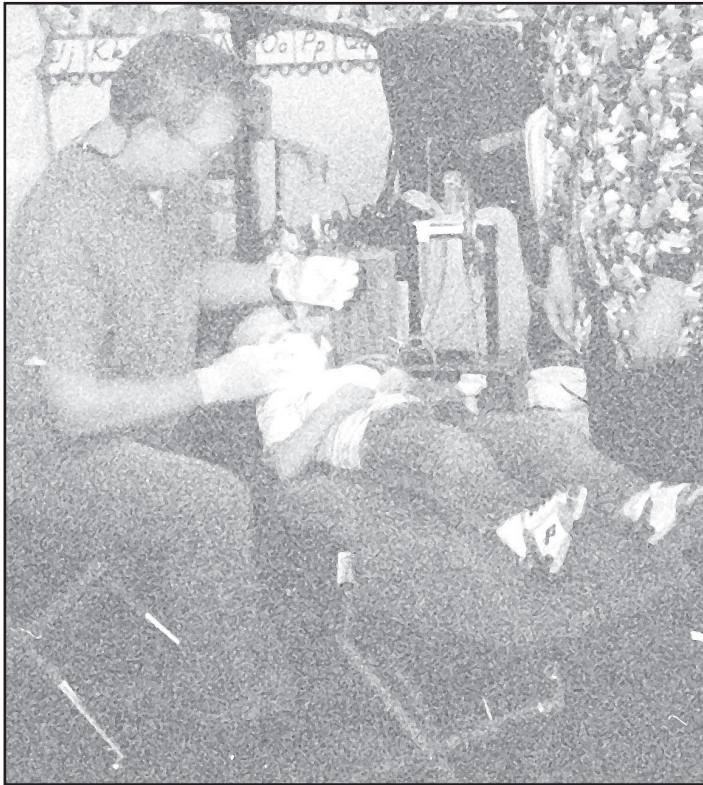

Then we had the tech crash, starting in early 2000 and that accelerated after the terrorist attack on September 11th. Again, we all wondered if America would get back to normal.

People have bet against America since our independence over 200 years ago. They all have one thing in common. They've all been wrong.

So, I'm not suggesting that you

buy stocks now. I don't know when the economy will turn around. But, I'm certain that it will.

Franklin Delano Roosevelt told us in the depths of the depression that the only thing we had to fear was fear itself.

Don't be afraid. Don't panic. And whatever you do, don't bet against the United States of America.
