

Golf team wins regional, heads to state

The Cowgirls golf team won the regional tournament Saturday at Lakin, beating the host team by one stroke, and will compete in the state tournament Monday.

The Cowgirls beat Lakin by one stroke, 423 to 424, on their own course and had three of the top 10 medalists. Senior Chelsie Gausman was second with 95 strokes after winning a playoff with Amy Stegman of

Holcomb, who also shot a 95.

Juniors Amber Douglas and Natasha Hillman finished 18 holes in 107 strokes. Douglas won the tiebreaker for ninth place, and Hillman was 10th. Sophomore Katlyn Topliff shot 114, her twin Kirsten Topliff 116 and sophomore Andrea Roeder 158.

Holcomb was third with 435, Syracuse fourth with 456 and Oakley fifth with 509. Hill City and Sublette had individual golfers but not enough for a team.

"I felt that the girls could have scored better," said Coach Connie Livengood, "as we had shot a 406 just 10 days prior to this tournament. Granted, the conditions were colder, but the course was the same.

"Lakin shot the same as they did at their tournament before, and that is about their average team score. I feel we let down this tournament, but I am really happy that the girls get to go back to state and that they have another great opportunity to play a

great course and have fun golfing. I am really proud of this team."

Gausman shot better this tournament, the coach said, and finished second after winning a playoff hole. Katlyn Topliff did a great job getting better by seven strokes, Livengood said; Douglas and Hillman had to play each other on a playoff hole, and Douglas won. All places for medals were played off, she said.

"All of the girls hung in there," Livengood said, "and it feels good to walk away with a

win out of a tough regional. I hope that we can get focused and bear down at state because this team has the potential to place in the top three teams if they play well."

State will be fun and another challenge to play against themselves and another course, the coach said — what a great opportunity for each one of these girls!

The Cowgirls will compete in the state Class 3-2-1A tournament Monday at the Emporia Municipal Golf Course.

A Goodland Cowgirls tennis doubles team has won sub-state and will compete at state today in Prairie Village.

The Goodland doubles team of seniors Kaitlin Fugleberg and Shonna Webster beat Thyfault and Husman of Plainville 6-1, 6-0 in the

sub-state semi-finals Tuesday in WaKeeney, continuing competition that was delayed by rain Saturday.

In the finals, they won a best of three 6-1, 4-6, 6-3 to beat the doubles team of Greeson and Schneider of Tribune to win sub-state. The Cowgirls had already beaten the Tribune duo at their home meet Sept. 16, at Colby Sept. 30 and in the

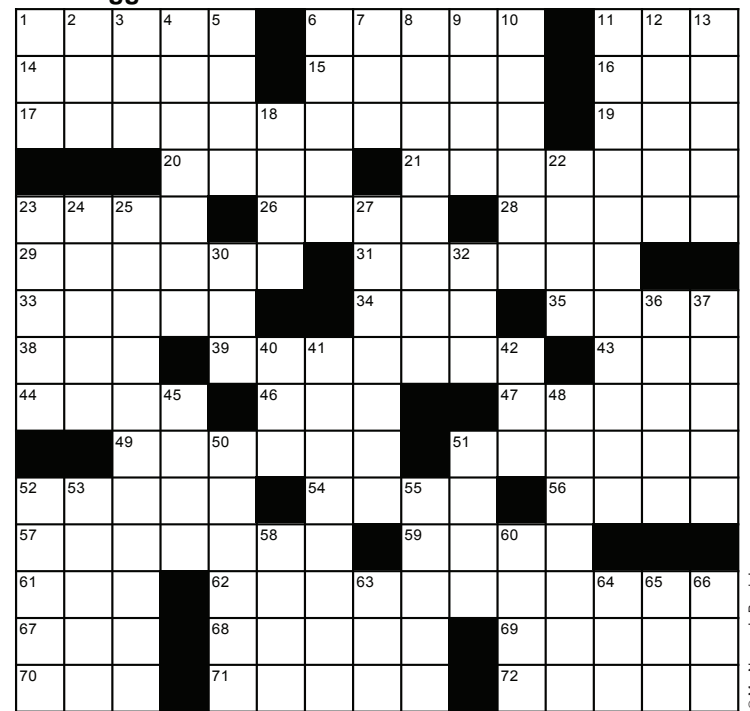
