Clothing they are collecting is

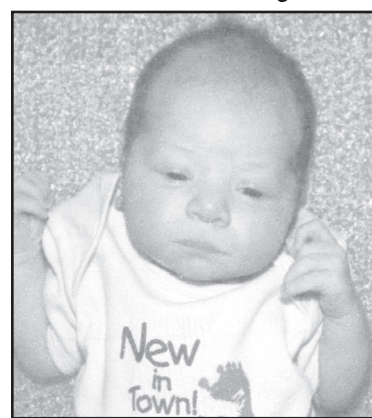
