Cowboys win 43-8 in district play

slcorcoran@nwkansas.com The Goodland Cowboys football team beat the Ness City-Dighton Titans 43-8 Friday, putting themselves in a position to have a chance at the playoffs this year.

The Cowboys had lost their first district game to Scott City but with Friday's win can make the playoffs by beating Norton by at least 13 points Thursday.

The Titans took the opening kickoff, but the possession was brief, as the Cowboys took the ball on a fumble on the first play. Goodland was in the end zone in less than four minutes and made the extra point.

Goodland added another touchdown and extra point three minutes later, got a safety about halfway through the second quarter and got two more touchdowns and an extra point, taking them into half-time up 29-0.

The Cowboys added another touchdown and extra point less than four minutes into the third quarter and another with two minutes left in the quarter. With Goodland up 43-0, the clock ran continuously the rest of the game. Ness City-Dighton managed to get into the end zone and get a two-point conversion half-way through the fourth

"I'm very proud of our players," said Coach Kent Teeter. "Their effort was awesome, and we had a lot of players that stepped up when needed and almost everyone got to play. "It was great being home, and it was an

exciting game for us. I'm most proud of how much we have improved in eight games. The biggest positive was getting in a lot of players. It was fun to see that many play.

"There were too many penalties, but we didn't let them stop us from making first downs. I thought we executed pretty well in all aspects of the game."

Offensively, Goodland had about 500 yards, he said, which was awesome. Defensively the Cowboys held them to just a few first downs in the first half and not very many total yards, he added; special teams had some really good returns and Goodland's coverage was pretty good most

Sophomore Nathan Deeds recovered the Titans' fumble on the first play. Senior quarterback Travis Angelos ran for 12 yards and a first down on the first play.

Senior Fernando Martinez carried the ball the next play and was hit by a host of Titans, gaining only a yard. Martinez carried for eight yards on the next play, was backed up a yard on third down but at fourth and two on the 10-yard line, he got the first down, setting Goodland up for first and goal at the 8. Martinez ran for two, caught a pass from Angelos for no gain and ran for the touchdown on third down. Senior Simon Grunfeld kicked the extra point.

Goodland took the kick off in the second half. Martinez carried for a loss, then Hillmer passed to Rome, who ran and dragged a tackler to get within a yard of the first down. Hillmer got the first down on a quarterback keeper. A pass to Rome got the Cowboys across the 50 yard line, and a quarterback keeper got another first down.

Hillmer threw a pass to Rome', who leaped after it but couldn't get high enough, but then Martinez ran for the first down. A pass to Oharah got the Cowboys another first down. At first and 10 at the Titans' 22, Hillmer dropped the snap but covered it and at second and 20, threw a pass to Rome, who ran it in for the touchdown. Grunfeld kicked the extra point.

Ness City-Dighton started on their own 29 after the kick and managed to get to midfield, but then Pearson intercepted a pass that bounced off another Cowboy's fingertips, and Goodland took over at their own. Goodland fumbled on the next play, however, and the Titans got the ball back.

The Cowboys put pressure on the Ness City-Dighton quarterback, and his pass was intercepted by Wilkens. At first and 10 at their own 25, Hillmer threw a pass to Pearson, had an incomplete pass and then a pass to Garth Helton, whose acrobatic catch gave Goodland the first down.

A pass to Rome gave Goodland another first down, a quarterback keeper gained another three, which was followed by two incomplete passes and a pass to Wilkens for the first down. A pass to Pearson gained eight yards. At second and 2 and the 19, Hillmer handed off to Bustillos, who ran for a touchdown. After Grunfeld's extra point, the Cowboys were up 43-0.

Ness City-Dighton went nowhere on the next play, and then Goodland was three and out. The Titans took the ball from their own 39 to Goodland's 33 in three plays, and then senior Micah Roehl ran for the Titan's lone touchdown. The two-point conversion was successful, making the score 43-8.

The Cowboys will be on their home field again at 6 p.m. Thursday to face the Norton Blue Jays.

'I'm really glad we have Norton at home," Teeter said. "By winning, we put ourselves in a chance for a playoff spot. Since Norton beat Scott City, if our calculations are correct, we need to beat Norton by 13 points to get into the playoffs.

"Norton plays hard and has a very good back and make sure we can line up correctly The Cowboys didn't lose any more yards to their offensive sets. Offensively, we need great game.'


