The wars in Afghanistan and Iraq continue to increase the demand on an already stretched Veterans Affairs system. In addition, the stigma attached to mental illness prevents many veterans who are in need of care from seeking needed treatment.

In 1982, Chris Hill (no relation to the writer) was honorably discharged from the Marine Corps and now works as a mental health counselor for the Jefferson Center for Mental Health in Wheat Ridge,

When discharged, Chris, who was experiencing severe anxiety attacks, admits that he made sure to remove the medical records in his permanent file about his visits to a psychiatrist, for fear of being

> Soon more veterans may be able to receive counseling from community-based organizations. On Friday, Oct. 10, President Bush signed "The Veterans Mental Health and Other Care Improvements Act of 2008" into law.

The new law directs the Veterans administration to contract with community-based healthcare organizations to provide mental health services in rural areas where access to Veterans Affairs services in inadequate.

But we should not expect mental health professionals to go it alone. Everyone has a role to play to help veterans overcome the stigma of mental illness including the following:

•Talk about your own and your we are a veteran, family member, illness and addictions as you would about any other medical condition, such as cancer or heart disease. Mental illness and addiction need to be discussed openly, not hidden

•Learn more about mental illnesses and addictions. Read and ask questions about these conditions and look for courses on mental health literacy in your community.

•Support veterans groups and your local mental health center's efforts to make mental health and addictions treatment available in every community.


