Football teams advance

The Goodland Cowboys football team missed the state playoffs after losing their final game of the season to the Norton Blue Jays, but eight of the nine teams Goodland played this year made the playoffs.

Of the Cowboys' opponents, three will advance to the second round. An area eight-man team lost in the first round.

The Oakley Plainsmen, who beat Goodland in their first game of the season, beat Atwood, who lost to Goodland, 29-18 in the first round of the Class 2-1A playoffs. Oakley scored a touchdown in the first quarter, recovered a fumble in the end zone for a safety in the second

quarter, scored a touchdown and extra point in the third and scored two touchdowns in the fourth. Atwood scored two touchdowns in the second quarter and one in the third.

Oakley will play at 3 p.m. today at Meade.

Norton beat Lakin 21-0 in the Class 3A playoffs, scoring all three touchdowns and extra points in the second quarter. The Blue Jays will play at 5 p.m. tonight at Beloit. Scott City, who beat Goodland in the first week of district play, beat Holcomb 19-0 in the Class 3A playoffs and will play at 5 p.m. tonight at Lyons.

St. Francis, who beat Goodland

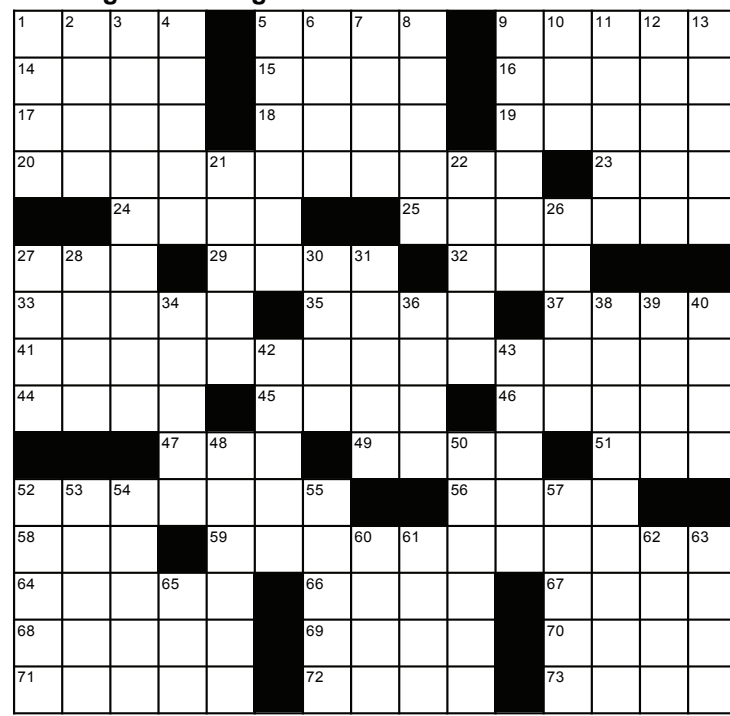
