land and encouraging others to come back after high school graduation is the goal of a proposed scholarship program Sherman County commissioners heard about last Friday.

Northwest Kansas Technical College President Ken Clouse talked to the commissioners about the project that had been explained before to the Sherman County Economic Development Council and the city commissioners.

Clouse said Bill Finley, director of support services and the endowment foundation, who has been with him for the other presentations on the Invest for the Future program, was unavailable.

Clouse said Finley had come back from the Economic Development Council's strategic planning session in August with the idea of finding a way to keep young people in the community.

Clouse said yes, but that is a large amount of money, and first they need to watch this program to see if it does help keep youth here.

Commiossioner Kevin Rasure said he felt the business community needs to be a part of that effort and help to find jobs for the ones who decide to stay here.

"You are right," Clouse said. "If we don't have the jobs they are not going to stay here.'
