Expert gardener shares tips for gardening

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Kay Melia, a familiar voice heard on radio and television for 57 years, grew his reputa-

tion as a gardener along with many good things to eat. Melia has written a book "The Gardener's Common Sense Guide to Vegetable Gardening in the Midwest" which he calls the "down and dirty way to handle a productive vegetable garden."

He wrote, recorded and mailed out copies of his short garden show from 1986 to 2006. The show was aired on around 12 radio stations by other broadcasters he

"I accumulated lots of copy from the show," Melia said. "And I decided to turn it into a book."

In his book he has included tips on soil, watering, preserving, varieties, recipes for cooking and tips for growing 28 fruits and vegetables. The crops he talks about are asparagus, green beans, dry shelling beans, beets, broccoli, cabbage, cantaloupe, carrots, sweet corn, cucumbers, eggplant, garlic, lettuce, okra, onions, parsnips, peas, peppers, potatoes, sweet potatoes, pumpkins, radishes, spinach, summer and winter squash, tomatoes, turnips and watermelon.

Melia said his favorite crop to grow is onions. He said the reasons people don't grow big sweet onions is that they don't keep them wet, don't plant plants and don't keep them weed free. He said that if you want green onions of scallions to eat you need to plant sets. Sets are little dry bulbs that can be bought by the pound or in a package. The plants

He said to plant the onion sets around three weeks before the

> expected last frost date. Onions love cool soil. The deeper you plant the little bulbs the more white tender part of the green onion you will have. They can be planted as close as 2 inches apart as they will be eaten early. Also plant a row of radishes and a little leaf lettuce and you will have fresh vegetables in 35 to 40 days.

Onion plants need to be planted early as well, he said.

ground at a time when the temperature dropped to 20 degrees and they were not harmed," Melia said. "Onion plants should never be allowed to dry out. Keep them until golden brown on both sides, comfortable moist from the day you turning once. plant them until a few days before you pull them."

Irrigating onions can help to prevent the only disease problems of blight and purple blotch. These problems are caused by moisture on dren. the leaves which can be aggravated by watering with a lawn sprinkler.

'The varieties I like are Candy for yellow onions, Super Star for yellow onions and Stockton Red Sweet for red," Melia said. Onions will let in St. Francis, Colby and Hays. It you know when they are ready to be harvested. The tops of the plants will flop over and around half of the bulb should be above ground. Its time to stop watering. After all the onions has gone down pull them from the tastes better than that that comes ground in about two weeks.

He said he does not leave them them and they will not store as long. District Free Fair with Larry Keirns are sold in twine-tied bunches or The sweeter the onion the harder it next year.

The best way he's found to store them other than braiding is to dehydrate them.

One of his recipes for onions is the following.

Onion Patties

3/4 cup flour

2 teaspoons baking powder 1 tablespoon sugar

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 tablespoon corn meal 3/4 cup milk

2 1/2 cups sweet onion, finely chopped.

vegetable oil Combine the dry ingredients and add milk slowly while blending. Stir "I have had onion plants in the in the onions and mix well. Using a tablespoon, drop small mounds of batter into a skillet containing the hot vegetable oil and press down slightly with the back of a fork. Fry

Melia has been married to Marilyn Johnson, originally from Garden City, for 57 years.


He has three children, six grandchildren and two great-grandchil-
