

Cowboys to hit mats Thursday

The Cowboys hit the mats 32 men strong with eight seniors, including four state qualifiers, returning and adding 13 freshmen to the squad.

The Cowboys had seven qualify for Class 4A state competition last season with five of seven placing in the tournament, one winning the state championship at his weight, one second and the team finishing




