He will be getting more treatment soon, she said, if he's strong enough and will have surgery when an infection is cleared up so he can.

In the meantime, his friends are trying to raise money to pay for it. "Tom's been our friend for more than 30 years," Cloyd said, "and has done a lot for the community. We

wanted to do something for him." And others were generous, she said, adding that when they asked for baked goods, many were provided and people offered to help.
