Season begins this week

Seniors Brandon Rome and Greg Farris were all-league last season, senior Travis Angelos was allleague in football and senior Adam Duell returns as well. They are a good nucleus, said Coach Brad

Juniors Kevin Amthor and Landon Brenner are returning, Bergsma said, along with a solid sophomore class of nine, which includes Brock Wilkens and David Murray, who played in about half of last season's games, earning letters in their freshman season.

Sophomores Garth Helton and Dillon Trachsel are also expected to be major factors this year, the coach said, adding that he hasn't filled out the complete varsity roster for the Topside Tip-off yet.

The team also has a solid freshman class, Bergsma said, with nine joining the team. Some will be able to contribute at the varsity level,

The coach said he's excited about the season and will be changing somethings. Goodland doesn't have a traditional post player, he said, like you see at many area schools but will instead work with a guardoriented offense.

That will be new to these guys, he said, and there will be some growing pains. With the Cowboys competing in Class 3A this year, Bergsma said, Holcomb will be the team to beat. They only graduated one player from last year's team that finished third at state, he said, but they are beatable.

"Someone will have a good night to beat Holcomb," he said. "I think we're capable of that."

The Cowboys are not a small team, Bergsma said, with 11 players

"With the age of the team," he said, "we can expect to have some turnovers, but we have some athletic kids and will do things offensively abilities '

The team has had a few early-season injuries, he said, pulls and twisted ankles, but is mostly

The Cowboys open the season Thursday at home against Ulysses, C-team at 3:45, junior varsity at 5:30




and varsity at 7 p.m.


