The Cowgirls start the season with only 14 members and will be working to gain experience and depth. Coach Don Smith hopes the team won't be judged on the early season but that fans will be patient and give support to help boost the girls' success as the season pro-

The team is trying to fill holes from experience, he said; it takes time to gain experience and depth. The Cowgirls started last season with an inexperienced team, he said, and gained experience as the season went on, but unfortunately, some of last year's players chose not to join


