Cowboys win first round at Topside

Goodland won the opening game on Thursday against the Wray, Colo., Eagles, 56-49, but lost the second round game on Friday to McCook, 59-39, and lost on Saturday to Wallace County in the third place game, 73-45.

Cowboys beat Eagles

In all three games the Cowboys fell behind in the first quarter. Against Wray the Cowboys managed to stay close and outscore the Eagles in the second half to win the game 56-49.

Wray took the early lead outscoring Goodland in the first quarter 16-11. In the second the Cowboys cut the lead by outscoring the Eagles 16-14 to cut it to three at halftime

In the third quarter the Cowboys tied the score at 32-32 with 6:30 remaining, and the two teams traded baskets, and the Cowboys tied the score again at 36-36 on a basket by sophomore Brock Wilkens.
