An Edson couple's son was a Kansas delegate at the 2008 National 4-H Congress, having the chance to see sights in Atlanta and participating in a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

Clay Schilling, son of Ron and Marsha Schilling, attended the 4-H Congress Friday, Nov. 28, through Tuesday, Dec. 2, in Atlanta, Ga., along with more than 950 youths and adults from 45 states and United States territories.

Those attending the Congress joined together to "Accept the Challenge of 4-H" at an educational event focusing on social and cultural programs and activities, leadership development and community service.

Schilling attended the National 4-H Congress through his work in the Beef Project and was selected through his Kansas Award Application. He received first alternate with his beef record at the Kansas State 4-H award application judging in 2008.

He is an 11-year member of the Prairie Dale 4-H Club.

With his beef project this year, Schilling had the grand champion steer at the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair, Grand Champion Steer at the Tri-State Royal, Grand and Reserve Grand Limousine heifers at the Kansas State Fair and the Supreme Reserve Grand Champion Heifer at Kansas State Fair.

The Supreme Heifer and Tri-State Royal Champion animals were raised out of the herd he started with his past 4-H heifers.

In 2007, Schilling was awarded the Kansas Key Award and the I Dare You Award for Leadership in the Sherman County 4-H program.

He was part of the Kansas delegation, which was the third largest in attendance.

The Kansas 4-H Foundation and the College of Agriculture from Kansas State University assisted in sponsoring the Kansas Group.

Youth delegates represent outstanding achievement in project work, attainment of the Kansas 4-H Key Award as well as citizenship and leadership in their local programs. Youths were motivated by speakers Dan Thurman, Dan Clark

and Barbara Chamberlain as well as Miss America 2008, Kirsten Haglund.

Two days of workshops were topped off with a morning of community service where all the delegates dispersed to more than 25 sights across the city to serve in parks, schools, food pantries and soup kitchens in sharing their commitment of selfless generosity toward others.

The event brought 4-H members to Atlanta over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend.

The planning committee took advantage of Atlanta's standing as an international city and exposed delegates to as many venues in the city as possible, including the Atlanta History Center with opportunities to tour CNN, the Carter Presidential Library, the Martin Luther King Jr. neighborhood, the Georgia Aquarium and other noted landmarks.

There were many workshops along with keynote addresses that rounded out the experience.

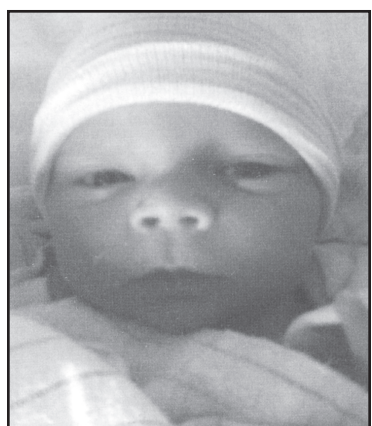
