City of Goodland, KS water has high levels of nitrate

Water sample results collected 11/4/08 showed nitrate levels of 13 mg/L. This is above the federal nitrate standard, or maximum contaminant level of 10 (MCL). Nitrate is drinking water is a serious health concern for infants less than six months old. DO NOT GIVE THE WATER TO INFANTS UNDER SIX MONTHS OLD OR USE IT TO MAKE IN-

What should I do?

• NOT GIVE WATER TO IN-FANTS. Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. Blue baby syndrome is indicated by blueness of the skin. Symptoms in infants can can develop rapidly, with health deteriorating over a period of days. If symptoms occur, seek medical attention immediately.

 Water, juice and formula for children under six months of age should not be prepared with tap water. Bottled water or other water low in nitrates should be used for infants until further notice.

Boiling, freezing, filtering, or letting water stand does not reduce the nitrate level. Excessive boiling can make the nitrates more concentrated, because nitrates remain behind when the water

evaporates. Adults and children older than six months can drink the tap water (nitrate is a concern for infants because they can't process nitrates in the same way adults can.) However, if you are pregnant or have specific health concerns, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

• Nitrate in drinking water can come from natural, industrial, or agricultural sources (including septic systems and run off). Levels of nitrate in drinking •DO NOT BOIL THE WATER. water can vary throughout the

year. We'll let you know when the amount of nitrate is again below the limit.

 Monitoring will change from annual sampling to quarterly sampling to see if seasonal fluctuations.
